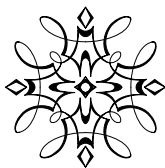

The Pastor's Corner

Peace and Goodness to all!

Why do the disciples of Jesus have such a hard time recognizing him in the Resurrection Stories of the gospels? Mary in John's gospel thinks he is the gardener, until he called her by name. The disciples who have gone fishing don't recognize Jesus on the shore. He tells Peter to cast his nets for a catch of fish, only when they catch the extraordinary large fish does Peter tell them all, it is the Lord. Today the Church reflects on the Gospel of Luke, that tells of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus who do not recognize him even while he speaks with them for an 11 mile walking journey. It is only when they offer him hospitality, and he blesses the bread and breaks it with them that his identity becomes clear to them. Then they return to announce the appearance to the other disciples who proclaim they too have seen the Lord. The mysterious relationship the disciples have with the risen Lord is one that unfolded in unique and meaningful ways for each and all of them. Then in sharing their stories, they are awakened to the full impact of what has happened to the crucified one. He is Risen indeed! The meaning of these revelations, continue to unfold for us even today in our own lives and in the life of the Church.

The difficulties of life with its setbacks, failures, disappointments, tragedies, and sinfulness can sometimes bring us grief, sadness fear and even despair. It is in these trials that we as Christians are called to recognize God with us in Christ crucified, whose death did not end in destruction, but in Glory. Mary when called by name, came to new life and proclaimed the Good News to the other disciples, The disciples encounter with Jesus on the shore brought them new life and joy that empowered them. The disciples of on the road to Emmaus by being hospitable to a stranger came to recognize the risen Lord in their fellowship. Each of these encounters are remembered so that we can recall the ways in which Jesus manifested his power for his loved ones, so we may always live in the sure and certain hope that God is at work to bring new life and new beginnings to all of our life situations. We are called always to watch and wait for the Glory of God to rescue us from trials, and bring new growth in wisdom, insight, and vitality to us. It is also incumbent upon us to remember the ways that God has brought us through and to tell others of the way we have met the Risen Lord in the outcome so that we like the disciples can rejoice that He is Risen as He said. We like those first disciples are called to be witnesses in the mysterious ways that God has been revealed in our lives as one who has brought healing, joy recovery and friendship. In this way others can begin to seek and find the Lord who wishes to reveal himself to everyone as the giver of life and redemption. Our stories unite with those of the Gospel to continue to proclaim the good news, that He is risen as he said, Alleluia!

We have many things to be grateful for in our parish this week. The many who received Easter Sacraments are listed in the bulletin, let us continue to pray for them and to rejoice that the celebrations will continue with two more confirmations this week for those who have gone through RCIC and we will have 60 children receiving first Communion later this month. Let us rejoice in the Lord.
