

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

There were three funerals here in the parish this week, and I want to say a special word of thanks to the Funeral Receptions Committee for their great ministry in extending the warmth and hospitality of Christ to all who were present for the funerals. One of the receptions on Monday morning was for Cay Maddaford, a long time parishioner and resident of Loyola Arrupe and one of our daily mass attendants while she was there. Cay also arranged for the setup of the First Friday Mass at the residence as well as the little receptions that followed. It was a joy to meet her lovely family most of whom came in from out of town. The other reception was for the funeral of Fr. Peter Botman SCJ, who was pastor here 25 years ago, and who also continued to assist me occasionally for daily masses. Fr. Peter often came to our social events and remained connected to some of our families. The Sacred Heart Fathers had a touching wake service for him on Tuesday evening that was attended by many parishioners, and the Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Wednesday morning. It was edifying to see the grateful witness that was given to remember his holiness, humility and priestly character. The community spirit of the Sacred Heart Fathers continues to radiate through our parish and so it was good to have them with us to celebrate this occasion. We will continue to pray for all of the faithful departed throughout this month of November.

Friday morning Archbishop Thomas Collins celebrated mass for the students at Marrocco Merton High school as they celebrate their 50th anniversary. It was a great honour for these students to have the Archbishop with them on the occasion. His inspirational message and their remembering his presence will stay with them throughout their lives. We give thanks to Archbishop Collins for his being here with us for this important day.

As you have heard, the new liturgical changes will begin to be prayed on the first Sunday of Advent, that is the last Sunday of November. I want to say a special word of thanks to Christian McConnell and Susan McElcheran who are doing great work to prepare us to sing the parts of the mass with these changes incorporated. Chris has also prepared a wonderful pew card incorporating the music in the context of all of the congregational responses. There will also be a pew card issued by the diocese placed when they arrive. Last week we began singing the new Gloria, as a part of the plan to introduce the changes so we can be comfortable with them. We will be explaining each of the changes as we go along, and Chris has generously offered to present a forum to introduce and explain these in the liturgical context for anyone who is interested in attending. The date and time will be announced.

The St. Vincent DePaul Society met on Wednesday evening and discussed their plans for Christmas toy and gift distribution. This organization cares for over 60 families and depends on the generosity of our parishioners to provide for them. St. Nicholas A.K.A. Santa Claus will collect toys from the Children in the Church for two weekends in lieu of not having an Adventure Sunday this year, and the St. Vincent DePaul Society will also make other times available for the collection of gifts to meet the needs of their important ministry.


