The Friar's Nook

Last week I talked about our parish family, but I also got a chance to visit with my own family during our friar's visitation in Massachusetts. Since I have been away either at college, or seminary, or assigned someplace, I haven't gotten to be around my nieces and nephews as much as I would like. And now as I get older, I don't get a chance to see my great nieces and nephews as much as I would like. This means that when I'm there I need to be the fun uncle. I try to absorb as much of them as I can in our short visits. Their youth and joy rekindle in me that sense of joy in my life (and hopefully some youth!). I felt this last month when I was visiting with the Friars in Japan. They have a school as well as a kindergarten. Although I could not understand the language, being around a group of excited toddlers who were jumping up and down communicated to me all I needed to know.

As we look to our parish community, quite often we just see adults or older people. There are children in our midst and I'm always happy to hear them at Mass. To highlight this, this fall we will be commissioning our first communion students at Mass as well as our confirmation students. Just like in the human family it's important for us to see new life ahead of us so two in the church family is it important for us to recognize the life that is around us in calling us forward.

One of the reasons for highlighting these youth is to show that in fact there is new life here in the parish especially when we're looking for people to help teach them. But also, and probably most importantly, is that they are a reminder for us to be our best and to be on our best behavior as Christians, so, as to be a shining example to them in their lives and in their faith. Oftentimes, we forget about our Christianity and let the worst of ourselves show forth. I can affirm this by the things that I hear in confession. We can easily forget that God is watching over us, so I think it's important that we have young ones in our presence to remind us that they are looking to us for guidance. That being said, we really should seek to be the best people we can with the help of God's grace.

In my first parish, I had many youths asking how to deal with being a religious minority because some thought that Catholics we're in league with the devil. I told them the only way I know to change people's minds is to be the best person you can be. It works for those inside and outside of the Church.


