

THE PASTOR'S CORNER PEACE AND GOODNESS TO ALL!

The parish council met this week with a hefty agenda to report on all of the good things that are happening throughout the parish organizations and to be informed of plans that are being realized in the ongoing stewardship of the parish.

We began with the Pastoral Vision that had been presented at the Coordinators retreat held on Oct.16, remembering how we identified the way we as a parish focus on the Sacramental life of the Church in all of our ministries and activities. Highlights of the various group activities were provided by the parish council representatives of our organizations. This displayed the marvellous vitality of our dedicated parishioners as they participate in our many parish activities and ministries.

Particular focus was given to the two new committees that have begun to serve the parish; Building Maintenance, and Communications. Building Maintenance has grown out of the Capital Campaign Building Committee to sustain the good work begun and to take a pro-active role in securing our facilities and seeing them kept in good repair and up to codes on an ongoing basis. The Communications Committee will assess our present status and make recommendations to meet our present needs, suggest options for our mission to proclaim the Gospel, and to assist in the hands-on Technical issues that occur as we sustain the parish communication vehicles like the website, bulletin and other means we have to communicate with the parish and all who seek the Lord through the life of the parish.

The Finance Committee reported that we are on target with the current financial needs and goals of the parish and presented the tools that they have developed to sustain current progress and meet the financial needs that are unfolding as we continue our growth and development as a parish.

The parish council responsibilities for the Winter Welcome Table participation were discussed so that this important outreach to the Homeless will be met in cooperation with its Sponsors (The Paulist Fathers, the Sisters of Sion and the Atonement Friars) and St. Peter's Parish where together we serve this ministry.

Finally we discussed the special visitation of Bishop McGrattan our regional bishop on the weekend of January 14-16. This process of parochial visitations is an initiative that will occur throughout the diocese over the next couple of years. It will begin here in Region 5. This will be an opportunity for the Archdiocese to look at the various pastoral and administrative operations on the parish levels, to help us all to benefit from best practices so that together we can fulfill the Mission of the Church for the archdiocese. The next Parish council meeting will be held on Saturday Jan 15, with Bishop Mc Grattan in attendance. May the Holy Spirit assist us in showing the Bishop how we serve God through our good stewardship of the many gifts we are given.

Of particular note, please remember that this weekend the Catholic Women's League will hold its annual Bazaar, and Adventure Sunday is November 21. These pre- Christmas events are always opportunities to get in the Christmas Spirit. You can get in early shopping through the bazaar, and of course Santa Clause will make a special visit to Adventure Sunday.

Thank you all for your wonderful generosity and dedication to the life and worship of our Parish.
