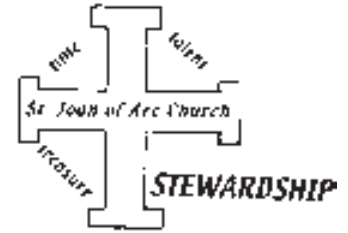

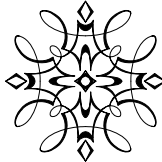

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and all Good to you and yours.

Well, the building permit to do the outside work arrived this week on the feast of St. John Lateran, and the work on the new stairs and the walls began right away which is obvious as you enter the Church. The work on the new kitchen, meeting room and storage spaces is also underway as is the renewal of the electrical and fire safety systems throughout the facility. We have had to make many scheduling adjustments and so we hope you will be patient with the process as we move forward. Several of our annual events like the CWL Bazaar and the Adventure Sunday have been eliminated or cut back because of the space considerations but we move forward to meet the needs of the poor that are served as beneficiaries of these events so please continue to participate to whatever extent is possible. Santa Claus will still be coming to Adventure Sunday even if his space is limited. He will need to leave the reindeer on the roof.

This week the finance committee members will begin their presentations to assist the parish in the sacrificial giving program and introduce the manners in which contributions can be made automatic from checking accounts or credit cards, as well as acquiring envelopes. If you are interested in this please call the parish office. Later on the ideas of creating an ongoing building maintenance fund through planned giving from bequests will also be introduced by this committee. We are grateful to these financial professionals who are helping us to introduce current ways of supporting the Church, may God bless their work and your generosity in following through on their introductions.

The Parish Council met this week and walked through the hall reviewing the current blueprints of the building project, all were favourably impressed with the plans and the progress we are making. We listened to the various reports of the various committees and continued to discuss the modifications of the procedures that will take place in January as the representation on the council is telescoped from 29 members to 9 representatives. This will permit a more efficient manner of providing leadership and advise me as your pastor. The 29 members will continue to meet semi annually in general meetings so that the spirit of cooperation and full participation of all of the parish organizations will be able to share and communicate the good news of their activities to all.

The Capital Campaign committee met last night to recap the progress of the capital campaign and to make sure we continue on schedule to meet the needs of the building campaign. All seems to be moving in the right direction, and I am deeply grateful to Cathi Richardson, Yolanda Russo, Paul Klie, and Jack Powers for their undying dedication to this effort that began our building project almost seven years ago and which is now coming to fruition in the building project.

Our RCIA program is continuing to grow, we have 6 persons who are seeking full communion with the Catholic Church, one Catechumen adult who is discerning baptism and one child in the RCIC program seeking baptism in the Easter Celebrations. We will be having the Advent retreat at the Friar's house on Laxton Ave on the 5th of December. Kudos to Mary Jago who has been keeping this program on track this season. Please continue to pray for the members of the RCIA program they truly represent our growing in Christian life and holiness as a parish.

As you can see we continue to move forward as a parish by the Grace of God as the many volunteers and dedicated parishioners devote their prayerful lives and hard work to the many parish endeavours that we undertake. May the Holy Spirit of God continue to guide us and grow the Kingdom of God in our midst.

How can I thank you enough for your love and prayerful dedication to God and this parish. You are a wonderful community!
