REFLECTIONS FROM DEACON ALEXANDER

Perhaps all the invitations Jesus gave us can be summed up in one word: surrender. We need to surrender to love. But why is it difficult? Shouldn't it be the most natural thing in the world? Isn't our deepest desire a longing to find love and surrender to it? True, our deepest desire is to surrender to love, but deep down we have some innate resistance to surrendering. Here are a couple of examples:

In the Last Supper of the Gospel of John, when Jesus tries to wash Peter's feet, he encounters firm resistance from him: No way! I will never let you wash my feet! What is ironic here is that perhaps more than anything else, Peter longed for precisely that kind of intimacy with Jesus. Still, when he offers it to him, he resists.

Another example could be seen in the struggles of Henri Nouwen, one of the most gifted spiritual writers of our generation, he enjoyed immense popularity. He has published more than 50 books. He was a highly sought-after professor (tenured at Harvard and Yale), received daily invitations to give talks and conferences around the world, and had many close friends. And yet, in that popularity and adulation, surrounded by many friends who loved him, he was unable to allow that love to give him any real sense of being loved or worthy of love. Instead, for most of his life, he trudged along within a deep anxiety that led him to believe that he was unworthy of love. At one time, this even led to clinical depression. And so, for almost his entire adult life, surrounded by so much love, he was obsessed with the feeling that he was neither loved nor worthy of being loved. What was it that kept him? One morning, waiting along the highway at a bus stop, he was hit by the rearview mirror of a passing truck. Urgently transferred to a hospital, for a few hours he was struggling between life and death. While he was in that situation, he had a very profound experience of God's love for him. He fully recovered consciousness and normal life as a deeply renewed man. Now, once he experienced God's love for him, he was finally able to surrender to human love in a way that he had been unable to do before his near-death experience. All his subsequent books are marked by this conversion in love. Why do we wage war on love? Why don't we give up more easily?

The reasons are unique to each of us. Sometimes, like Jacob in the Bible, we are unconsciously fighting against God (who is Love) and, consequently, we are unconsciously waging war on love. In the biblical story where Jacob wrestle s all night with a man, he has no idea that he is wrestling with God and with love. In his mind, he is fighting an adversary whom he needs to conquer. Finally, as the darkness of the night gives way to more light, he sees what he is struggling with, and it comes as a surprise and a shock to him. He realizes that he is waging war on love itself. Seeing it, he ceases to struggle and, instead, he clings to the same strength with which he had previously been

with the plea: "I will not let you go until you bless me!" This is the final lesson we need to learn in love: We fight for love with every talent, trick, and strength in us. Finally, if we are lucky, we have an awakening. Some light, often a paralyzing defeat, causes us to see the true face of what we have been waging war on, and we see that it is not something to be conquered, but the very love to which we have been longing to surrender. This is the love of our God. And this is surrender, not resignation: something we surrender to, rather than something that defeats us. + **Brother Alex**
