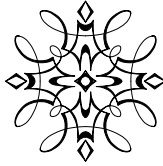

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

Vive Christo Rey! Long live Christ the King. This phrase is proclaimed throughout the world this Sunday, as we end the Liturgical Year and move from Ordinary Time in the Church calendar to the Advent season with the first Sunday of Advent coming next week. The world around us is moving into the holiday season with its commercial focus promoting much shopping and spending to celebrate this time. Our focus is quite counter cultural for this season in that the time of Advent calls us to patient waiting and prayerful vigilance. We await the celebration of the Nativity of our Savior Jesus Christ remembering the longing of His Coming throughout Salvation History.
