On October 30th the Friars and Sisters of the Atonement celebrate 110 ten years since our reception into the Roman Catholic Church from our Anglican Foundation as the Society of the Atonement in 1898. Foundation Day is celebrated by the Friars and Sisters each year as we remember the history of the discernment of our founders and their courageous step in Conversion to the Roman Catholic Church where we continue to pray and work for the Unity of Christians and the reconciliation of all people with God and one another to realize the prayer of Jesus, "That all may be one". On Wednesday evening the 30th of October our RICA program gathered as usual bringing people who are inquiring of the Church in the process of discernment to be baptized as adults or to come into full communion with the Catholic Church. The gift of discernment and conversion continue in the life of the Church through this program at St. Joan of Arc every Wednesday at 7:30 in the parish meeting room all are welcome to participate in this program which presents the teachings of the scriptures and the traditions of the Church in a systematic way to prepare for the celebration of the Easter Sacraments in that season. If you or any one you know might be interested, we will continue to accept participants until Christmas time.

Monday evening, we had a gathering of individuals who are interested in assisting us in the process of re-invigorating our Stewardship commitment to living and proclaiming the Gospel and being a welcoming parish. It was an inspiring meeting and was a good start for the process to be developed in this our 100th year. Thank you to all who participate in making our Stewardship Parish a vital and inspiring place for all to feel welcome.

On Tuesday, I spoke with Arturo Gonzales about becoming a member of our Parish Ministries Committee which will oversee the re-invigoration of Stewardship efforts. He has agreed to come on board with this dedicated committee. Many of you know Arturo who has been an active member of our parish for many years and who lends his marvelous voice to the 10:00 Choir. We are looking for new members for our Finance Committee to replace some of the members whose terms have expired. The Building Committee met on Tuesday evening and reviewed the many projects that are underway. We had good news there, also that the "Iron Friar" campaign to restore the doors and tower has brought in over \$32,000 and this will cover the cost of the doors when work begins on them very soon. We will continue to receive donations for this until the end of the year. Thanks again to Ivan Kastelic and Tony Horvatin who have already restored the door handles and replaced them.

The youth group celebrated Halloween on Monday and a ghoulish character appeared to shower them with treats. This is a great and enthusiastic group of young people and we are so blessed to see their energetic participation in the parish. Thank you to Liam Silveira who assists in the leadership of these young people.
