### The Pastor's Corner Peace and Goodness to All!

At the end of the Gospel reading today, Jesus tells us that God is not a God of the dead, but rather the Lord of the living. This faith of ours is demonstrated in the devotion we have in remembering the deceased members of our families and friends on All Souls Day. Each year as I read the names in the parish "Book of Life" that are submitted by our parishioners, it reminds me of the many of my own deceased friends and relatives. It gives me pause to recall the many ways I have been touched and loved by so many who have gone before us, "marked with the sign of faith". What a beautiful gift we have in remembering our beloved deceased relatives. As I recall the words and gestures the talents and contributions to my life that were given by those who have passed on, I realize that these dear people continue to live in my mind and memory. I realize that every time I plant a garden, my grandmother's skills are remembered and repeated in the present. Every time I meet a homeless person, I remember the kindness that my father demonstrated in caring for such people and how he taught us to treat all people with respect and tenderness. The many sayings of my mother and aunts that continue to echo in my own voice and the voice of my siblings, will most likely be repeated by my nieces and nephews for generations. If the deceased loved ones we have are so present in our own minds, how much more are they and we present in the mind and heart of God. Jesus tells us that God is a god of the living and we know that for God there is no past or future, but only an eternal now. Now as we remember the deceased each November. we participate in our faith that we are made for eternity. God so loved the world, He sent his only Son into the world to redeem us. He entered our life in time, so we could enter the eternal life of God. On all Souls day we celebrate this faith of ours. We rejoice that God remembers us and our loved ones in ways that far surpass our own human capacities to remember. His love for each one of us in our particular lives and all of us as the community of faith united in the Body of Christ are held forever in the eternal presence of God. How great is our God!

This week on Tuesday the ministries committee met to discuss the fact that other friars will be coming to Toronto to live in our house of discernment on Laxton Ave. This will mean that I will have some assistance in the ministry of the parish.
