The Friar's Nook

For the past few months, we have been promoting the ministries here at Saint Joan of Arc, in hopes of getting more full participation of the congregation. I keep trying to stress that we're not looking for volunteers. Christ did not call volunteers he called disciples. The things we can do for our parish family are our form of discipleship. As I say parish family, I truly mean that. Christ came to make us daughters and sons of God, hence we are brothers and sisters in the church, a family. This means that we not only get support from God and from prayer but from one another. Just as in a family, we don't have the same role or function, and sometimes we don't always get along, we are still united by something stronger, in the church it is Christ.

I have been stressing my desire that every member of the parish be involved in at least one thing, one service, whether it is to the parish family, the world at large or God himself. I am not alone in this. The second Vatican council called for" full and active participation in the church". This was because people had become passive and came to church simply to receive something. Well, we do receive something, we are also called to give something and not just to the collection, but something of ourselves. It has been more than fifty years since the second Vatican Council, and we are still struggling for that "full and active participation". When people don't even respond to the prayers at Mass or sing the songs which are meant to unite us as a family of God, then I guess I shouldn't be surprised when we don't have people active in our ministries!

Maybe we were al traumatized as children and told not to make any noise in church. I notice that when I'm visiting my family, and I attend mass, the people around me look at me when I sing the songs and the mass parts as if to say, "What are you doing?" I simply smile and carry on in hopes that my example may rub off on others around me.

I have a priest friend who says to his congregation "If you are just coming her to "punch your ticket" then don't bother coming". These are people who will have their children receive the sacraments but don't come to church. This happened a lot in my last parish. When I would meet with the kids to answer their questions and they asked, "What is that big room over there?" they were referring to the church, as they had never been to church but were here to get trained to receive their sacraments! I ask you all to seek to do your part in the Church and look forward to it.
