# The Friar's Nook

This month we celebrated All Saints, and we remember All Souls. I'd like to say that in the early church all Christians were called Saints because that's what we were called to be. The people we recognize in the church today as Saints, are those who have been canonized - a rather extended process of examining the lives of these people, the work they have done, and the impact they have had. The founder of the Friars of the Atonement, Father Paul Wattson is in just such a process. The first step in the process, after death, is to be elevated to Servant of God. That's where Father Paul is right now in the process. The next step is to be elevated to Venerable, followed by Blessed. The final step his canonization as a Saint. When the church canonizes a person, it is saying that it believes the person has made it to heaven and hopefully can intercede for us here on earth. It's important to note that there is no process of "demonization" in the church. That is they say we're sure this person is in hell. But that doesn't stop us as individuals from doing just such things, judging others and pronouncing eternal sentences.

It's important to remember that we are not called to judge others, living or dead, but rather to strive to love and forgive as best we can. I know it's not easy, but it is what we are to do as Christian. It can be a painful process but in pain there is growth. I have been working with my dog Sonya on physical therapy to get her used to using her prosthetic leg. Suffice to say she hates it, but I keep explaining to her that she will be better in the long run. I don't think she believes me even though I've shared with her the physical therapy that I've been through. Five years ago, I had my right ankle replaced and it was a slow painful journey back to walking again but now I can joyfully say that when a friend came to visit last month, we walked all over St. Lawrence market and then from there to the CN Tower and back again. Prior to my surgery and physical therapy, I was in a rigid leg brace and walked with a cane. My friend apologized for the amount of walking we did, not realizing how far away the CN Tower was but I just smiled and said I was happy to be able to do it because five years ago just walking around the Saint Lawrence market would have been impossible. Nobody likes pain but at least we can realize that sometimes it serves a purpose. I'm not sure I can communicate that to dogs, but I keep trying anyway looking forward to the day when she can run with the other dogs.

As I mentioned, we also remember All Souls this month. Differentiated from All Saints, All Souls refer to anyone who has died. We don't say that they're not in heaven just that they have not been canonized officially. I can think of many souls in my life, that I'm absolutely sure are in heaven. And I'm sure you can too. One of our older friars shared a story that when he was a student one of his fellow students would always pray at mass for the least remembered soul who had died. since this was a regular prayer of his he figured that the least remembered soul was being remembered all the time so in humor he prayed for the second least remembered soul so they wouldn't miss out. Praying for the dead is a longstanding tradition it even precedes Christianity. But as Christians it means something more. Christ died so that we might live forever so I often advise people not simply to pray for the dead but pray to the dead. I know now that I talked to my parents more regularly than I ever did when they were alive. And that's what prayer is about, whether it's prayer to God or prayer to others, it's having a conversation.

But having a conversation means also listening so we need to stop talking sometimes in prayer you may hear the words of God or the consolation of those who have gone before us.

This month let us listen to what God, the saints and all the Souls have to say to us.
