



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Celebrating an anniversary is a great mile stone in the life of any individual and institution. It is for this reason that I address myself to all of you on the 90th anniversary of the establishment of your parish family. Maybe there are still some of the parishioners who remember the early days of the parish and can share great stories of struggles and joys of building the faith community that you have now become.

Today's world offers different challenges to the Church than 90 years ago. Issues are different and ways of doing things have changed. One thing remains: faith in the Lord Jesus and all that this implies both individually and collectively as a community of faith.

As I am in Rome and cannot be with you personally to celebrate this event in your history, I have asked Bro Kevin Goss, a member of my General Council, to represent me at your celebration. Please know of my prayerful support for you and know also that it is a great honor for the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement to have been called to serve you in your efforts to build up the body of Christ and to bring the Good News of salvation to the people of your communities. The Friars are dedicated to prayer for Christian unity and reconciliation. Since Jesus prayed before he died "that all may be one so that the world may believe in him" (John 17:) this mission is also part of every one's baptismal commitment to be followers of the Lord and seek the unity of all those who believe. I pray that your community is also a community of reconciliation and peace both from within and as a shining example to those outside of you. Many of you have written to me asking that the Friars will stay as your pastors. We will do our best to honor this request. However, Friars do not grow on trees! I need your help in promoting vocations to the religious life and ministry in the church. I need your help to encourage young people to take up the challenge of denying themselves and to take upon themselves the living of a common evangelical life as Franciscans of peace and reconciliation. This way we can be assured that there will be other Friars to come and serve you in your gospel mission as pilgrims on the way.

As I celebrate the Eucharist on the Feast of all Saints in our church in Rome, I will remember all of you in the breaking of the bread. May your older members continue to recount the stories of your faith journey and may your younger members continue to dream dreams of new possibilities for creating a world of peace and justice and may we all, young and old, grow ever more faithful in becoming the Body of Christ to the glory of our God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen!

#### A message from Archbishop Collins:

At this time it is necessary for us to elevate our diligence to the next level in pandemic planning. For the health and safety of all people of faith, parishes must implement the changes outlined below at all masses as of <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 3</u>, 2009 until further notice.

Temporarily suspend communion on the tongue. Parishes should provide hand cleaning stations near church entrances. Refrain from shaking hands during the sign of peace. A nod, bow or other appropriate gesture should be encouraged. All those distributing communion are asked to wash their hands before mass. An alcohol-based sanitizer should be provided so that all ministers may sanitize their hands before and after distributing communion. Please remind your parishioners that if they are feeling sick or ill, it is best for them to stay home.
