

The Friar's Nook

As I write this, I am aware of the uncertainty that is going on to the south of us. The elections are over but there is still no decision. The only thing we can say for sure is that at least the political ads have stopped! It can be easy to point the finger and say, "What's wrong with them?" but maybe we should use the example to look at ourselves and try to be the best that we can be.

I have seen people on both sides argue that God is on their side! Maybe that's the problem – God needs to be in the middle but has been pushed off to the side. As we have all been going through challenges, personal, local, and global, we need to remember to pull God into the center of our lives. Otherwise we end up divided, certain of our righteousness, and alone.

Christ came to us so that we would never be alone, after all he is Emmanuel – God with us. We need to recognize his presence and follow his lead which brings us reconciliation, with God AND each other. Remember that Jesus chastised the pharisees for relying on their own self-righteousness and not on the righteousness of God.

I have encountered this in people's attitudes that they should be able to do as they want in church and not follow anyone's rules. I have had to explain that these rules are not in place to personally attack them but rather to protect each other! If we can't care for each other then we might as well not call ourselves Christians. Christ cared for us to his death. I'm sure that none of us are being crucified for wearing masks, social distancing, or following rules. Remember that even on the cross Jesus was socially distanced from those who hung on either side of him!

Maybe the problem is with the term "social distancing". Perhaps "physical distancing" would be better because we should not be socially distant from one another but rather physically distant. As Cardinal Collins reminds us "We are an incarnational Church", God took flesh in Jesus to be infinitely close to us so it's difficult to be separate. We need to be careful not to retreat into individual silos as we physically isolate from each other. In fact, we need to find new ways to nourish our social interactions in these times because remember "whenever two or three gather in my name, I am present". We need to find ways of being with and for each other to be Christ in the world.

As a Friar of the Atonement, I am especially sensitive to the call to unity, to be At-one. In today's world it is even more necessary to find ways to come together, spiritually if not physically, laying aside our wants and desires to take up the desire of God. We need to support each other not tear them down. We may not agree with each other, but we can't let that continue to divide us. There is just one heaven and we might be surprised at who we encounter there. We are not in charge; God is, and if we don't like who else is in heaven God will give us permission to leave! But remember, there is only one other place to go.

Jesus came to establish the kingdom of God among us. We can either choose to build the kingdom of God or our own kingdom, it is our choice.
