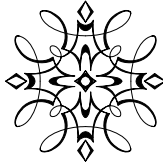

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

The Gospel today remembers the words of Jesus to the Pharisees instructing them of the two greatest commandments: First, to love God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength, and second to love our neighbour as ourselves. These commandments are honoured by persons of many faith traditions, and as Jesus tells us, "on these two commandments hang all of the law and the prophets. The eloquent simplicity of these commandments does not mean they are easy to observe. It takes all that we are and all that we have to live them as Christians. Jesus himself gave the example of what they mean when he gave his life on the Cross offering his whole heart, soul, mind and strength. In this one supreme sacrifice he demonstrated his Love for God the Father, and for all humankind. His commandment to all Christian people follows, "Love one another as I have loved you.

Our life in the Church provides the opportunity for us to grow in love and to spend our lives demonstrating our faith in these commandments. The sacraments are designed to empower us to live this gospel message. In Baptism we die with Christ and rise to the new life given to us in Grace. Confirmation seals us with the Holy Spirit and makes it possible to live our baptismal commitment to love one another as Jesus has loved us. The sacrament of Marriage is one which provides the opportunity to realize the love of Christ who tells us: No greater love has any one than to lay down their lives for their friends. People who profess vows in religious life, of poverty, chastity and obedience do this to live intensively their baptismal commitment. Ordination to priesthood is an empowerment to live the gospel and celebrate the Love of Christ through the sacramental life for the Church especially in the celebration of the Eucharist which is the source and summit of our life of love in the community of the Church. This is where we realize the love of Christ in the world.

Tuesday evening we held the initial gathering of our new Ministries Growth Committee. This is comprised of individuals who have long been engaged in the life of the parish and the Church. This committee will work to gather the material we have been working on as stewardship committees of the parish, to help us clearly articulate our mission and vision. Using the work we develop at our annual retreats, they will help and direct us to implement strategic plans that will realize the particular character of St. Joan of Arc Parish. The Stewardship Committee and the Parish Council serve to sustain the operational vision of our parish. This committee will be empowered to help me to guide the direction of these committees as we sustain the blessed and unique character of St. Joan of Arc for future generations. The meeting was a great blessing and sign of new beginnings that incorporate the life of the parish and all of the work we have been doing for the past three years.

On Oct. 22nd the Stewardship retreat will gather the leaders of each of our parish organizations and committees to celebrate the insight and vision we have realized and sustained in our previous gatherings, so we can take it to the next level of development. At this retreat we will also introduce the changes to the liturgy that will begin the first Sunday of Advent. This will reaffirm the Eucharistic Liturgy as the source and summit of our life as Church, and help us to recognize the ongoing life and development we celebrate.

As a friar of the Atonement, I work in continuity with Fr. John my predecessor, and with the SCJ priests who preceded him. It is mine to listen to the community as the Holy Spirit directs us to serve the parish as a part of the Archdiocese of Toronto which is called to realize the Life of Christ mandated in the Great Commandments to Love with all we are and have.
