

THE PASTOR'S CORNER Peace and goodness to all of you!

Like many of you I have been watching the rescue of the Chilean miner's from the first one last night to the 33<sup>rd</sup> tonight. What a glorious symbol of the death and resurrection of Christ. We have been so moved with each one as they surfaced. The word they sent on a note attached to a drill telling of their survival inspired the world to create the means and the vehicle for their recovery. The stories of each life that was recovered and their collective experience inspires us all. I have been so moved to see a number of them make the sign of the cross as they emerged.

This is a spectacular story of faith hope and love; it proclaims the Gospel poignantly to all the world. We share their gratitude because God has delivered them to new life, through the marvellous cooperation of many people from many places. The talents and technologies of many persons have worked together giving testimony to the value of human life. Thanks be to God. As I write this, the last of the three of the rescuers was just brought to the surface of the earth. What love these rescuers have shown; to risk their own lives to save the miners. This story is testimony of the best of humanity working together for the highest human values. God is good; and as this demonstrates, so are God's people. Blessed be God.

Today at our staff meeting we completed our itinerary for the Parish ministry and organizational coordinator's retreat on Saturday. We pray that God will inspire us all to continue to do the work of the parish with love and grace so that we may reflect the Kingdom of God in our midst. We are grateful to the 30 individuals who have come forward as leaders in our parish. Thank you all for your prayer and support as we continue to grow these areas of ministry and stewardship for the parish.

Wednesday evening the RCIA program met at our weekly gathering, to engage the six new persons who are candidates to receive the Easter Sacraments with our community. Once again we are blessed to participate in the conversion experiences of these persons who have encountered Christ in our parish. We are thankful to God for calling these persons to be with us in this holy time of their lives. Thank you all for your hospitality and care for these persons who bring us to new life in Christ.

Thursday evening, the building committee gathered to bring closure to our current building projects and set the stage for the formation of an ongoing building maintenance committee to meet the ongoing needs of our building facilities. We are profoundly grateful to the members of the building committee whose many hours of hard work and dedication to the renovation projects have brought the majority of the Capital building project to completion. Thank you all.

As ever it has been a busy week here at St. Joan of Arc parish. We are grateful to all of you for your prayerful stewardship. May God continue to bless you and yours richly in love and grace!

The Archdiocese of Toronto has completed the revised Policy & Procedure for Cases of Alleged Misconduct. In April 2010, Archbishop Collins announced that the Archdiocese would establish a group of lay experts to review current practices. The group has concluded their work and in September 2010, meetings were held with priests, deacons and lay staff of the Archdiocese to review the document.
