The Friar's Nook

Last week I drove Fr. Tim back to Graymoor so now I'm the last friar in Canada. Hopefully that will change soon enough. At our meetings we talked of men joining us from South America, Puerto Rico, Europe, and even possibly South Korea! It's nice to see new life coming into the friars even though it means change. They can't join us soon enough as far as I am concerned. Seeing the old friars at Graymoor after a year and a half was surprising. You expect changes in young people over that length of time but not changes so radically in older people. The retired friars have gotten more frail and it was sad to visit the cemetery and see how many more new graves there were. But it was certainly a great experience being back with the friars on the General Council and meeting all of the new employees who have been hired since COVID. We are blessed to have people working with us who embrace our Atonement charism.

I brought Sonya to get fitted for a prosthetic leg this week. Hopefully next week she'll be wearing it. It's a little scary because last Saturday night with only three legs she was able to nudge over a dining room chair climb up on the chair then climb up on the table and grab treats the parishioners had brought for her! She had a real party, but I guess I wasn't invited. I can't imagine what she will accomplish with four legs! She is becoming less and less shy about people as is witnessed by her walking into the congregation at Mass. I've set up a restraining system to keep her from getting too far since she won't listen to me if she thinks people have treats. I pray for St. Francis' help as she adapts to her new leg. Speaking of St. Francis, we will be blessing animals in honor of his feast day on Sunday October 3rd at 2PM in the parking lot (or should I say barking lot). Please feel free to bring your pets great and small for a blessing.

Later this month I have a retreat with Cardinal Collins and the priests of the diocese. I just had to submit proof of vaccination to attend. While it will be good to get together it reminds us of how much the pandemic has control of our lives. I know some people grow tired of all the regulations, as do I, but until this is passed, we will continue to do what we must. I have had people complain and leave the church because they couldn't sit where they wanted (as the seats were already filled). I feel for the people who volunteer to usher, they shouldn't have to deal with this grief. Also, last Sunday, there were people coming to Mass at 10:10, 10:15 even 10:30. I know this because of the constant knocking on the doors and continuing ring of the doorbell. I hope these were people with some mental illness because they might not understand that the church was full, and they were disturbing an entire congregation at prayer. If I could hear it from the front, I imagine those who were sitting closer were even more disturbed. Should it happen again, I will check the security cameras after Mass to see if we need to hire some security. I don't want those who are at Mass to feel trapped.

At my General Council meetings, we focused on the future especially post COVID. I think it would be a good thing for us as a parish community to focus on. What can we do to attract new life, how best can we support the life of the parish? And most especially, what am I

personally being called to as a steward at Saint Joan of Arc? Jesus calls us to carry his ministry out into the world, but if we cannot minister to one another here in church we will not be able to serve others in our community.
