

***The Friar's Nook***

Communion is the ultimate gift of God. It calls us to common union with God and with each other. This is manifest by the communion procession, our walking itself together is a sign of prayer and unity. It is not a time for a private prayer because we're supposed to be singing together as one body to show our unity with each other as we seek unity with God.

After we receive communion, we return to our seats and then we have time for private prayer. This usually should be prayer of thanksgiving for what God has done and is doing in our lives and the supreme gift we have just received. We conclude our private prayer after communion with a common prayer. This is followed by the final blessing. A lot of people leave right after they have received communion. Not only does this not allow for prayer and reflection it also skips out on a blessing! I don't know about you, but I certainly could use as many blessings in my life as possible.

And finally, there is a recessional song. The priest leaves the sanctuary, and the congregation leaves the church. It is our marching forth together into the world. You don't need to wait until the song is over, as it's a song for the procession of the congregation not just the priest.

Speaking of song, let me say a word about the music at mass. The music is there to support and unite the congregation. We are united as a congregation when we sing the music. Vatican II reminds us that we should seek full and active participation in the liturgy. That doesn't mean simply listening or reading along but "full and active" participation.

You'll notice that I haven't said anything these past few weeks regarding announcements. While they are not a part of the liturgy, they are important to the life of the community. Here at Saint Joan of Arc, we do announcements after communion. I've been at other churches where they do the announcements at the beginning of Mass before the Mass starts. The challenge of course is that if you have the announcements at the beginning of Mass, those who arrive late miss the announcements. And if you have the announcements at the end of Mass, those who leave after communion miss the announcements. I suppose we could do announcements at both times, but wouldn't it just be better to be on time for Mass and stay till the end? Maybe someday...

I hope these past few columns have been helpful in your understanding of Sunday Mass.


