

# The Friar's Nook

After the homily at Mass, we begin a transition. We begin with the profession of faith - the Creed. You may have noticed that during lent those in the Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults [RCIA] are dismissed at this point. This is because they have not professed the Creed with us formally and have not yet become one with the Catholic Church. Historically the liturgy of the word was open to anyone the faithful and perhaps and potential converts as well but the liturgy of the Eucharist it's reserved exclusively for those fully received enter the church.

What follows is typically called the general intercessions or the prayers of the faithful but is formally called the universal prayers. They are "universal" because they are for the whole church and the world. This is not a time for particular personal prayers. To be prepared to celebrate the liturgy of the Eucharist this should remind us that we are a universal church and not just simply a local congregation.

Although this is not technically part of Sunday Eucharist, the collection usually takes place after this. The collection, occurring at this time, should remind us that what we give, we give to the church universal

At this point we move into the second part of the Mass – the liturgy of the Eucharist. We begin by setting the altar. The paten or plate with the bread is placed on it. The chalice or cup is placed is placed then the water and wine are brought up. Initially, water was added to the wine because in ancient times, especially in desert area, wine was more concentrated, and the water was added to make it more palatable. Also, the alcohol in the wine would purify the water making it safer to drink. Eventually this was overlaid with spiritual meaning regarding the divine and human natures of Christ.

Then the priest washes his hands. Remember that this was after the offertory and quite often what was offered was fruits, vegetables, grain, and livestock. The priest, after receiving these gifts would wash his hands so that they were clean for the rites he was about to perform. In time this too was overlaid with religious meanings. At some point people believed that it was symbolic of Pontius Pilot washing his hands of his involvement in the death of Jesus! It is not. It has been retained as a reminder to ask God to cleanse us in preparation for communion. In the Eucharistic prayer we participate with the priest who is presiding over the Mass. He is not the celebrant as we are all celebrating the Mass, but rather he presides over the celebration.
