THE PASTOR'S CORNER

May the Peace of Christ fill your life with hope and grace.

Today we received news that Bro. John Baptist Hildreth, SA suffered a stroke while in South Carolina visiting his twin brother. When I spoke with him on the telephone today he said that he was doing alright, and that he would be in hospital for a few days and will continue there with his therapy as long as necessary. He would like to thank us for our prayers and wants to assure us that he is confident that all will be well. Thank you for your prayers.

It has been a busy week, following Thanksgiving Day, the week has been filled with activity. Following from months and years of hard work, we are ready to move forward with the capital building projects. The Capital campaign committee met on Tuesday night to discuss the financial status of these efforts which have been managed so well by the committee. Yolanda Russo, our treasurer has illustrated current total pledges at \$1,036,347. Collected pledges at \$799,964 with outstanding pledges scheduled for collection at \$236,383. This places us in the right position to begin this next phase of the building project in the next couple of weeks as soon as the city permits are in the hands of the contractor. We are working to integrate the Capital Campaign Committee, the parish Finance Committee, and the Building Committee in ways that promote optimal functioning and cooperation to strengthen our parish operations and management.

This evening the Building Committee, led by Les Muniak our chairman approved the letter of intent to go ahead with bids put forward by Pantar Inc. that meet with Larkin Architect's drawings, and our budget parameters. The bids went to "tender" on October 6. The project will focus initially on the exterior work on the stairs and retaining walls with the goal of completion before winter comes. Next, will come the necessary lighting in the nave of the Church, the new kitchen in the hall and the addition of meeting and storage spaces in the hall. In order to optimize the economic benefits, the contractors will engage in some simultaneous projects to complete the work as quickly and as well as possible.

We expect that the hall work will not begin before the 90th Anniversary party "All Hallow's Harvest Fest on the 24th of October, but we may need to make some adjustments for the November 8th, CWL Bazaar, if the work in the kitchen has begun. Suggestions were made to make sure we can continue the traditional pancake breakfast should the project commence before this date. We are assured that we will be able to go forward utilizing our Church and Hall in the midst of the construction, even though some parts of these may be cordoned off periodically. We thank you all for your patience, flexibility and confidence as we move forward.

The RCIA program gathered this evening, as yet two more new members were introduced. This is a great sign of new life and vitality in the spiritual life and development of our community. Please continue to pray for our candidates as we journey forward through the liturgical year to celebrate the Pascal mystery of Christ our Saviour at St. Joan of Arc.

Indeed we have much to celebrate as a parish, and we are grateful to God who holds us in the Heart of Christ. I want to thank you all for your many years of loving life and service to the community, May God Bless you richly in Grace and Peace.
