#### Peace and Goodness to All!

It is great to welcome everybody home as the school year begins and we resume our autumn schedule of activities. Please keep your eye on the bulletin to be informed of the dates that our activities begin throughout the months of September and October. The ministries committee has been working throughout the summer to redesign our Stewardship promotions and procedures. There is a brilliant draft of the brochures being developed to reflect the growth and changes. We hope to develop the website to accommodate the messaging as we progress. The STEWARDSHIP REFRESHER is a worthy effort that we hope will promote full involvement of the whole parish community and perhaps draw others to be welcomed to participate in the life and worship of our parish. Thank you to all in the ministries committee who are inspired to bring us to LIVE and PROCLAIM the GOSPEL and welcome all to our parish. The Iron friar has returned from Lake Placid with the finisher medal from Ironman 70.3 to complete the task begun with the Tupper Lake Tinman in June where he completed 70.3 to total the 140.6 Ironman distance in halves this year. This was the first time in 23 years that the whole number was done in parts, but with age and wisdom comes the ability to do the math and take things in sensible stride. Thank you all for your contributions to the Ironman campaign this year, it is obvious that the funds are being put to good and immediate use.

The brickwork on the building and the tower is close to being completed, and we have found the professionals to restore the stained glass doors in the near future. More work is being done on the carpeting to make the stairs to the sanctuary safely visible and prevent tripping. This past year we refreshed the entire sanctuary area with a new presiders chair and arrangement to celebrate our 100th anniversary. There is much work in progress and we are grateful to all of you for making it possible to enhance our worship space.

Tuesday evening the finance committee met to begin their work year schedule and outline the costs of our works and project the financial necessities for the coming year and future life of our parish. They will be addressing the financial realities to the community in the coming weeks. We are deeply grateful for the professional expertise and advice they bring to our pastoral mission. The costs of the current work will be upwards of \$250,000 and we thank you for your generosity in making the necessary renovations possible. Contributions for the Ironfriar campaign go directly into the building maintenance funds that will pay for the work being done.

It is clear that this our 100th year is one that celebrates vitality spirituality community and growth as a parish. The physical work on the building and the interior are a mere symbol of our ongoing life and work as a parish, it is but a reflection of the real blessings and works the Lord empowers us to realize as a parish of faith hope and love. Your warmth and loving spirit of welcome extended to all who come here to encounter the Love of God provides the edifice of "living stones" that build the Church, the Body of Christ. It is in this sprit that we are once again launching our dedication to Stewardship in prayer, to use our time talent and resources to fulfill the great mission of the parish. This is the mission of the Lord Jesus Christ to proclaim and live the gospel so the world can believe and come to salvation in Christ.

Welcome back to all who have been away for the summer. Welcome to all who are here for the first time and and blessings to all who are here to make this parish a welcoming place to encounter and love the Lord. You are a wonderful and gracious community and we are so privileged to serve you. Thank you for your dedication, love and participation in the life of our parish.
