The Pastor's Corner *Peace and Goodness to All!*

Welcome home to all who have been away for the summer, and to all who have been here all along. It is always amazing to me how quickly the summer season passes. Next week we will welcome the choirs back to their music ministries and we give a special thank you to Michael, Antoine Kyla, Thomas and Brie-Anne for their service throughout the summer Sundays. We are blessed to have such dedicated musicians to enhance our worship. I pray this summer has been a time of refreshment, relaxation and good family and fellowship with friends and loved ones for everyone. Most of you know I was away in Lake Placid at the end of July and completed my 21st Ironman race coming in first again in the elite category of Iron Friar. It would be in the plural form, but there was only one competing this year so I had the distinction of being in both first and last place. Thank you all for your generous support of the Iron Friar campaign, it raised \$18,227.70. This will more than cover the cost of the furnace repair and the air conditioning units that were placed in the meeting room and office areas. What a blessed relief it was to have these areas cooled in this extraordinarily hot summer.

In the first week of August we were honored by the visit of Fr. Jim Loughran, SA the Vicar General of the Atonement friars and the director of the Graymoor Ecumenical and Interfaith Center who brought two summer interns to present an evening discussion of Interfaith and Ecumenical dialogue procedures. This presentation was designed to give us an idea of the sensitivity and importance of the dialogue processes that continue to bring mutual respect and understanding among the various religious and faith traditions of the world. This summer internship involved work done in our Ecumenical and interfaith centers in Rome Italy and New York City. The presentation was also given in the friar's parish in Sterling Virginia, near Washington DC. The internships are designed not only to educate young people in the practices of Ecumenical and Interfaith dialogues, but to promote vocational interest in the Friars of the Atonement. Next week, I will be going to our novitiate house in Assisi to cloth a new Novice into the habit of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement. Earlier in the Summer we had a gathering here in the Friary of 5 young men to talk about vocations and to encourage them to consider religious life. Let us all continue to pray for Vocations to religious life and priesthood, especially in those communities which live and serve us in the parish.

Ana Da Costa has been working with Cyndy O'Grady to prepare for the coming Stewardship Weekend at the end of September. Please see the bulletin for ongoing details of this important annual event in the life of the parish. As we begin a new season we are also beginning a new adult scripture and religious education program in conjunction with the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, RCIA in late September. If you or anyone you know would be interested in becoming Catholic through adult baptism and initiation into the sacramental life of the Church, please contact me or the parish office.

Once again, welcome home everyone. Let us pray the Holy Spirit will guide us throughout this year to walk ever more faithfully in the footsteps of our Lord Jesus Christ to become the parish we are called to be: Living and Proclaiming the Gospel through Stewardship of our God given gifts. 
