

#### **Priesthood**

"Call no man your father on earth". Why then, I would ask, do Catholics address their priests as "Father"? I cringe now, not so much at my misunderstanding of Catholicism as my misunderstanding of the Bible. After years of researching and praying, it became clear to me that the Scriptures indeed present God's priests as fathers. In biblical religion, a priest is a father – and even more a father than the man you or I might already call by that name "on earth," our natural or adoptive dads. Let's begin at the beginning. In studying the Old Testament, we can divide the history of the priesthood into two periods: the patriarchal and the Levitical. The patriarchal period corresponds to the book of Genesis, while the Levitical period begins in Exodus and lasts until the coming of Jesus. Fatherhood is the original basis of priesthood. The very meaning of priesthood goes back to the father in the family – his representative role, spiritual authority, and religious service. The firstborn is the father's heir apparent, the one groomed to succeed one day to paternal authority and priesthood within the family. From the beginning, priesthood belonged to fathers and their "blessed" sons. As all Christians are identified with Christ, the Church becomes the "assembly of the firstborn". St. Peter, speaking to the Church, takes up the standard that Israel had lost in the desert: "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people". Now once again, priests are fathers in the Church, which has now become "the universal family of God". The apostles, who were Christ's first priests, clearly saw their own role as paternal. St. Paul asserts his spiritual fatherhood: "For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel". Paul was a father not because he was married and reared a family; he did not. He was a father because he was a priest: "a minister...in the priestly service of the gospel". That is the true biblical teaching. Our priests are so much more than managers or functionaries. They are fathers. The sacramental priesthood is not so much a ceremonial function as it is a family relation. Thus, my pastor is father to a large family. Before God, he must take responsibility for thousands of people. His fatherhood is not merely metaphorical. True fatherhood involves the communication of life. As a natural father, I have communicated biological human life - but, in the sacraments of baptism and Eucharist, a priest communicates divine life and the divine humanity of Jesus Christ. Because of his spiritual fatherhood, an ordained priest requires our respect every priest, in spite of his weaknesses or sins. When God said, Honor your father and your mother," he didn't qualify the commandment. He gave no exceptions. When a man fails in priesthood, we should pray for him, confront him privately with our concerns, confront him with other witnesses; and, if all other attempts fail, we should take our

case to the bishop, all the while honoring the man, his priesthood, and his fatherhood. This is what children do for their fathers.



Our community congratulates all of those who have received and those who will be receiving their Confirmation. May the spirit of Jesus guide you in your future ministry.

I have been informed that some literature has been distributed in our neighborhood regarding a new Rogers Communications tower in our parking lot.

This project was made known to our community in the bulletin of March 7, 2010 with an information meeting on March 10, 2010 in the church. A second information session was held at St. Gregory Catholic School on the evening of April 21, 2010. The concerns and requests of the last meeting were addressed and the requested information was supplied by Rogers Communication within a few days of the meeting.

In consultation with a number of parishioners, this project has been in the discussion phase for well over twelve months.

I'm sure many of you are aware that St. Gregory's Catholic Church is a 'landlord' of Rogers Communications and has been for well over ten years where transmission equipment and antennas have been in place, on the south east corner of our property.

The proposed changes are at the request of Rogers to improve wireless services to the area.

Rogers is presently in the process of applying for the required permits and will advise us of any developments. I shall in turn do the same through bulletin updates.
