## DOCTRINAL CORNER

### When is it necessary for me to go to Confession?

Generally speaking, besides the obligation of annual Confession (*Code of Canon Law, c. 989*), the Church encourages its faithful to make use of the sacrament frequently and regularly.

Specifically one should confess all his/her sins, and especially mortal sins which destroy the sanctifying grace in the soul. While Confession of venial sins is not always necessary, one must confess mortal sins.

Mortal sin is (1) a grave matter that turned one away from God in (2) full knowledge of the evil of the act, and with (3) full consent of the will. All three conditions must be met for a sin to be mortal (*CCC 1855, 1857*).

Venial sins do not destroy the sanctifying grace in the soul, but it diminishes and wounds it (*CCC.1855*). Venial sin injures one's relationship with God or with the neighbor or with oneself, in lesser matters of the moral law, or in grave matters acting without full knowledge or complete consent (*CCC: 1862*).

### SOCIETY OF SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL CHRISTMAS GIFT DRIVE 2021

While we are still a ways from the start of Advent (November 28<sup>th</sup>), due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, our Conference like many other organizations, has had to continue our amended approach to assisting our Neighbours In Need. As you might expect and as the media has outlined, there has been a heavier negative impact from COVID-19 on our client base than the general population. For your information, last Christmas we assisted 173 families including 522 adults and children with assistance totalling \$11,700 plus your generous gifts.

Since March 2020, we have only provided our clients with food vouchers by mail as we have tried to eliminate the risk to our clients and members, by avoiding all in-person visits. For this reason, **for Christmas 2021, we are again unable to deliver toys/gifts you have generously provided under the Angel Tree for many years.** Alternatively, we are appealing to you, our Parishioners, to provide Walmart or Shopper's Drug Mart gift cards which will allow parents to directly purchase small gifts for their children. While not ideal, it will allow mail-out along with a Christmas Food Voucher. If you are able to support our work this year, denominations of \$5 / \$10 / \$25 would be preferred so we could spread it out for an expected large demand this year. We will be doing our mail-out the first week of December to allow for usual Christmas mail delays, so if you are able to help, **please drop the gift cards off at the Church Office before December 5, 2021.**

In addition to the above, as fund raising is limited in this environment, we would gratefully accept monetary donations over this period via Poor Box envelopes, or via the special St. Vincent de Paul collection scheduled for the weekend of **November 21st.**

Please accept our sincerest thank you in advance for thinking of the needy in our Parish Community over the upcoming Christmas Season.
