

**From Father Mark:** After the final blessing at the 1130am Mass, and as the church emptied, I must admit that I was a bit sad. We had done so much since Ash Wednesday: the prayers, true fasting and the taking care of the poor. On Fridays many people sat in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament to pray for the world and later that night prayed the Stations of the Cross. On Palm Sunday we heard of Jesus' entrance into the Holy city, and we participated during the three days as that moment of our redemption was made known to us as we crossed the threshold of the empty tomb. I was drifting as I made my way to my family and turkey.

I have truly been in reflection mode since. I was thinking about the many people in the Saint John Brebeuf community who live their faith in a way that draws others to sense their hearts burning within them. I think of the people who minister full time in our parish: Debbie Dusanek, Tom Bailey Robertson, Kim Graeili, Mira Salter and Eddie "Number 1" Melo. They all come because these are more than just employees or staff members; they are people who have felt the call of God to serve, and they do it with joy and generosity. Sometimes some of us treat them like servants, but these amazing people rise to the occasion and continue to do what they are asked to do. They are gracious, funny and incredibly faithful. I am proud of them and am in awe of them. We should keep them close to our hearts. Often we miss the opportunity to be gracious because we don't want to embarrass, and some people hold back a compliment because they don't want the person being complimented to have a swelled head. I would say err on the side of the compliment. A true disciple doesn't get full of themselves, they smile and say thanks.

There are so many people who work so hard, quietly, and lovingly.

At the liturgy: greeters, readers, servers and extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist – these people are the front line; they show hospitality and concern – Thank you.

At the liturgy: music ministry – no one has any idea of the time commitment our three ensembles commit to for us. I thank all the members and the support of Tehillah (Saturday Night) Emmaus (Sunday 930) and Una Voce (Sunday 1130) Incredible gifts shared for all– Thank you.

**From the liturgy:** we have people who pass on the faith, in the Share the Word program in our parish catechism program, in our Confirmation Formation, RCIA, Baptismal Prep and Marriage prep – and all they do comes from that line at the end of mass, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." Thank you.

**From the liturgy:** many people quietly, without fanfare, bring the presence of Christ to shut-ins, the sick and those who are living in care facilities. From the celebration on Sunday they hear another dismissal "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord with your life." Thank you.

I am in awe of your generosity, your faithfulness and your unwavering support of the Mission of the Church lived out within the Saint John Brebeuf community. Pope Francis challenged us during holy week to be people of Joy and despite our weariness. This Parish exudes that delightful moment of joy whenever two or there are gathered in the name of Christ.

Please pray for vocations. The call to priesthood, the Religious life, to Christian Marriage and to the consecrated life is still coming to us – and we need to glorify God by hearing and sharing that call.

Thank you for your faith, for your patience and for your love. I am so blessed to be here as your pastor. Let us pray for each other.
