## April 12/13, 2014: Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord: Matthew 21:1-11; Isaiah 50:4-7; Ps 22; Philippians 2:6-11; Matthew 26:14-27:66

Complacency abounds in the story of Jesus' passion. Judas needs motivation to betray Jesus; he asks the chief priests, "What will you give me if I betray him to you?" In the midst of Jesus' anguish in Gethsemane, the disciples are indifferent and bored, even to the point of falling asleep. The way Judas betrays Jesus smacks of willful ignorance: rather than pointing him out to the crowd directly, he feigns an amiable greeting and kisses his master. No one seems willing to accuse Jesus with any measure of certainty and persuasion. False witnesses are drummed up, but their testimony proves nothing. His accusers strike Jesus' face. Before their eyes, he is slowly dehumanized, and they grow bolder. If they can hit him, perhaps they can kill him too.

Still, it proves difficult for Jesus' accusers to kill him themselves, so they hand him off to the Roman governor. Pilate determines that the charges are false, "For he realized that it was out of jealousy that they had handed him over." Rather than do something about it, Pilate shirks any responsibility. He hands off the decision to the crowds. No one person made a concerted choice to put Jesus to death. It was through an obtuse series of events that allowed Jesus to be handed over, passed on from group to group, like some unwanted annoyance.

No one protests or objects to his prosecution, not even Jesus himself. No one except Judas, that is. Upon seeing his master condemned, Judas repents of his betrayal and tries to return the bounty he collected on Jesus. Perhaps it would have been easier for Judas if Jesus had resisted, put up a fight, or tried to run away. See, for all that talk about being God's son, all that noise he made about undergoing great suffering and being killed, Jesus was just like everyone else—worried about saving his own skin. Did Judas think he was exposing a phony? Maybe he thought the arrest would scare some sense into Jesus and he'd leave behind all this dying and rising talk. Instead, Jesus calls Judas friend and tells his disciples not to fight to try to rescue him.

Jesus' Passion destroys sin; it kills our pride with scandalous humility. For the times we feel mighty and the strong, like the priests and the governors, the Passion exposes our self-righteousness. Could we have chosen the Cross ourselves? It accomplishes something we could not do on our own. Without it, we have nothing to stand before God and boast of. With it, we can say that God has given all things over for our sake. How can we respond to such love? "At the name of Jesus, every knee should bend... and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord!"


