April 14/15, 2018: 3rd Sunday of Easter

Third Sunday of Easter: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19; Psalm 4:1, 3, 6, 8; 1 John 2:1-5, Luke 24:35-48

While preaching in Jerusalem, St. Peter called Christ by a special title—the Author of life. It's an evocative title. It captures our sense of life unfolding before us like a story. It ascribes to God the power of crafting the narrative of our lives. It's a beautiful way to think of God as this creative source of all that we are. Indeed, the crowd St. Peter addressed would have believed that God propped up their very existence. We share this belief that God is actively involved in shaping our lives—a least most of the time. We can call this belief sharply into question during times of tragedy.

The death of a child is perhaps the most trying experience a parent can face. We place our hope in our children. If there is any assurance that the story of life continues after we're gone, we find it in knowing that the next generation endures beyond ourselves. We see in our children a real sign that the story of life carries on past our own death. So to see a child die is to call into question our very sense of being sustained by God. Last week, the terrible loss of life from the bus accident outside of Tisdale, Saskatchewan, has people all across Canada and beyond asking why God would allow so many young lives to suddenly end. We imagine the heartbreak of the families suffering the loss of their loved ones and the hurt that must be rippling through their communities. News like this opens up old wounds for other parents who have also had to bury their children. Such tragedy shakes our hope and our trust in the future.

The disciples on the road to Emmaus were also traumatized. Their hopes that Jesus of Nazareth would be the one to redeem them had been dashed. Yet they were also astounded by reports that his tomb was found empty. Jesus himself accompanied them on the road, though they thought him a stranger. Slowly they came to recognize him as he opened the scriptures to them and broke bread with them. They hurried to share the good news with their friends, and in the midst of their sharing, Jesus again stood among them. While they stood in disbelief, Jesus opened up their minds to the story God had written from the very beginning and revealed through the prophets. God's love endures forever, so we can hope in eternal life. The answer to suffering is not found in death, but in God's love that lasts even after the story seems to end. We sometimes catch fleeting glimpses of the glory of eternal life, and other times the glory of the Risen Lord is hidden from our eyes by tragedy. Sometimes we are still waiting to see that the Author of life is already walking beside us on the road as we grieve. It's a road Jesus has walked before; we can hope to find him on it again. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson
