

April 15/16, 2017: The Resurrection of the Lord

The Resurrection of the Lord: Acts 10:34, 37-43; Colossians 3:1-3; John 20:1-18

Mary cried outside the empty tomb for her friend. She expected to find Jesus, but she was looking for a body, not a living person. What a moment it must have been for her: alone, weeping in the dark, bewildered and afraid. "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." She included the disciples who accompanied her, Peter and John, in her statement of confusion. Surely they were upset that Jesus was missing too? Then, upon seeing the empty tomb for themselves, the men left Mary and returned home, leaving her by herself next to the gaping hole. Her plea became even more forlorn, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." She no longer shared her grief—it became solely her own concern.

Grief is terrible to go through, but as if that weren't enough, there can come a point where it a fixture of its own. In place of a dead body to mark her grief, Mary was settling in to hold on to her hurt instead, to connect with it, to form a memory of it. Like a landmark, her grief could serve as a fixed point, so she could always find her way back to Jesus. Through her tears, she gazed deep into the empty tomb, trying to sear its image into her very self. If she could carry her pain forever, then in some way, maybe a part of her lost friend might always be with her too. At least, that might have been her plan—since his body had been taken away, she would become a tomb for Jesus herself. "Tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away," she cried, as though she herself would become a resting place for the Lord.

Instead of leaving her to grieve in the dark, God turned Mary around to face the dawn of a new day. Standing behind her was the very one she longed to see, not as a dead body, but alive and present. Her temptation was still the same: to hold on. Instead of an empty tomb, now she could cling to her teacher; but God had something else in store for her. "Do not hold on to me," her Lord tells her. The new day the Lord has made is not for sitting in the tomb, but for rising out of it. Who was thought to be lost, has been found. Who was dead and buried, has been raised to new life. This day the Lord has made cannot be captured or contained—it will not be entombed. We enter into it only by rejoicing in it, not by clinging to it. We can, therefore, dare to set our eyes on heavenly things, because God has turned us away from the emptiness of death.

The Seeds of Friendship Concert

Joie de Vivre Choir and Plain Salt are collaborating on a second Seeds Of Friendship Concert in support of Our Place/Chez Nous Drop-In Centre. The concert will take place on Sunday, April 23rd, 7:00 PM, here at St. John Brebeuf Church. The program will include Spirituals and Old Favorites, such as You Are My Sunshine, A Place In The Choir, The Parting Glass; a group of folk songs in various languages where the choir is "back-up" to Plain Salt; and a medley of sing-along songs featuring the word "Smile"! The concert is FREE; donations of food, clothing and money are gratefully accepted, and all cheques made out to Our Place/Chez Nous will get a tax receipt.

Our Place/Chez Nous Drop-In Centre is known to its visitors as "The Cross" because of the large brown cross above the entrance at 676 Main Street, across from Thunderbird House. It is open Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9:00 AM to 11:45 AM. The visitors are mostly homeless people from the inner city. They get coffee (reputed to be the strongest and best in the neighbourhood), snacks, clothing, toiletries, take-away ("emergency") food, a chance to take a shower, and a place just to "hang out" for a few hours, playing cards and computer games. It is a haven, a refuge from the hurly-burly of life on the street, a living space for those who don't own one. Many visitors are "regulars", whose interaction with the staff is both friendly and mutually respectful. A registered charity, OP/CN runs exclusively on donations and volunteers, primarily, but not exclusively, from the Roman Catholic parishes in the Archdioceses of Winnipeg and St. Boniface. OP/CN enjoys and is extremely grateful for the support of Constable Kevin Burkett, who drops in every day to chat with both visitors and staff.

The present membership of Joie de Vivre Choir is around fifty singers. It began in 2001 as a program for seniors in the Preparatory Division of the Marcel A. Desautels Faculty of Music at the University of Manitoba. The choir has since become an independent entity for mature singers of all ages under the leadership of John Tanner. The choir's accompanist, Charmaine Bacon, a virtuoso flutist as well as a wonderful pianist, obtained her BMus and MMus in flute performance from the University of Manitoba and the University of Toronto. The choir rehearses on Saturday mornings in the St. John Brebeuf Parish Hall, and presents concerts twice a year, both at St. John's College Chapel on the U of M campus, and at St. John Brebeuf Church.

Plain Salt is a folk group specializing in Celtic music: Karen Limbert Rempel, vocals and bass; Blair Mahaffy, vocals and guitar; Andy Hallonquist, mandola and whistles; and Donald Willms, percussion. Their performances are always exciting, whether they are playing before a large or a small crowd. Their name speaks to their musical attachment to the Canadian prairies (Plain) and to the Maritimes (Salt). Although Plain Salt has collaborated with choirs in the past, this is the first time they have joined forces with Joie De Vivre. Plain Salt has produced a full-length CD, entitled "Bread and Brandy", which will be available for purchase at the Concert, and which includes a couple of the songs from the Concert. 
