

# April 18/19, 2015: Third Sunday of Easter

Third Sunday of Easter: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19; Psalm 4; 1 John 2:1-5; Luke 24:35-48

For the disciples, Easter turned out to be a huge disappointment. Imagine their expectations of Jesus: they knew him as a charismatic leader, a compassionate healer, and a wise teacher. He healed the sick with a word or a simple touch. He called disciples to himself and lead people to radically change their lives. He told stories that connected people to the history of God's action recounted in scripture. He was at once as familiar as a good friend, yet he never failed to surprise those closest to him. They followed him to Jerusalem hoping to be amazed once more, only to see their formidable rabbi condemned and executed without so much as a word of protest from him. They might have left Jerusalem questioning their own experiences of Jesus. He was so easily taken down by false accusations and fear-driven religious leaders--perhaps Jesus hadn't been as powerful and effective as they had thought him to be?

We're only a few weeks out from our own Easter celebration, a time of renewal and conversion, yet we might find ourselves living life more or less the same as before. Wasn't the whole point of Holy Week to lead us to change our hearts, to grow closer to God, and live a new life in Christ? Then why do some of us find ourselves still wound as tight as a drum and stressed out over the smallest things? It doesn't seem like Christ is the Lord of our lives when we can be so badly shaken up over things that don't go our way. Even if we are doing okay ourselves, we probably all know someone who seems to be in survival mode—someone who is just barely scraping by.

That's the mindset I imagine the disciples had as they made their way to Emmaus. They seemed disillusioned and let down by the one they trusted the most; it was all they could do to just put one foot in front of the other to get some distance between themselves and what happened in Jerusalem. Along the way they meet a stranger, who invites them to share their story. As they shared their hopes and disappointments with him, Christ did what he had always done for them—he connected the broken bits of their lives to God's story. God, the author of all life, writes our stories in new and wonderful ways, so we can live beyond our frustrations, even beyond death. As Jesus broke bread with them, he broke open their story and wrote a chapter for them beyond their imaginations. The two disciples rushed back to Jerusalem, ready to enter back into their grief with the hope of a different ending. This Easter, we may know someone who needs to share their story. We can listen to their disappointment, as Christ did for his disciples, with hope that the Risen Lord once again connects our whole lives to God, even our frustrations and our let-downs.
