

Fourth Sunday of Easter: Acts 4:7-12; Psalm 118; 1 John 3:1-2; John 10:11-18

Helpers get overwhelmed sometimes. Workers face unreasonable demands on their time for little compensation. Recently, author James Bloodworth wrote about his experience with casual work in his book *Hired: Six Months Undercover in Low-Wage Britain*. While working as a picker in a warehouse, he discovered the workers were so pressed to meet their productivity targets that they had to relieve themselves in bottles rather than lose time visiting the washroom. He described the work culture as "prison-like." Managers implemented a penalty-point system to deter workers from taking sick days, even with a doctor's note. When employees burn out from this kind of treatment, they are simply replaced.

When Jesus talks about hired hands in today's Gospel, I can't help but sympathize with them. Why should the worker lay down her life for a flock that is not her own? When conditions become unbearable, the worker flees to preserve her life. We may very well find ourselves in a situation we would rather run from than endure. Burnout can hit helpers of all kinds: parents, teachers, ministers, caregivers, spouses, nurses, doctors, administrators, and assistants. Each of us have a breaking point. You, or someone you know, might be facing an overwhelming situation. It's through no fault of our own that we are limited creatures who only have so much to give to others.

In Christ, God became a creature like us, and entered into an overwhelming situation. A mob seized and arrested him. His friends abandoned him and scattered into the night. Those in power imprisoned and tortured him, then falsely accused him of the very unrighteousness he spoke against. Others spoke on his behalf and mocked his identity. Though the Roman governor knew better, Pilate looked on indifferently and allowed the truth to be washed away; he literally rinsed his hands of any involvement. Incompetent bureaucrats and self-righteous leaders bungled their way to crucify Christ. Jesus was just another victim of the machinations of those who found their worth in garnering power for themselves. They chewed him up and spit him out without a second thought.

But Christ was not another helper the wolves could overwhelm and scatter. This time, the owner of the sheep sent his very Son to be the Shepherd. Christ the Good Shepherd overcomes all opposition, so we can belong to God. There is no force on earth that can separate us from the love of God. There is no obstacle that blocks Christ from reaching us. Even death itself, that seemingly unscalable barrier to our happiness, melts like wax before the burning light of Christ's love. In Christ, God's love never burns out or fades, but endures all things so we might have life in Him. For this, Christ is the only Good Shepherd we ever need.
