

April 25/26, 2015: Fourth Sunday of Easter

4th Sunday of Easter: Acts 4:7-12; 1 John 3:1-2; John 10:11-18

When we come together as a church to do liturgy, God does more than gather us in the same room on Sunday morning. We call our congregation an "assembly" because we're more than some parts carelessly thrown into a bag. God has thoughtfully called each of us here to serve some higher purpose for the sake of the whole. What we are being shaped into is both at once known to us, yet remains to be revealed. If you've ever built something, whether it's slapping together a bookcase with a miniature hex wrench or whether you've built an entire house from the floor up, you know that the final product is usually much more impressive than the picture on the box or the blueprints. What do we imagine God is creating out of us? We have Christ as our example, our foundation, the stone the builders rejected who became the cornerstone. Just as the builders rejected him, we too can sometimes be limited in our imagination what God has in mind with us—we might feel more like flat-pack furniture than a living sculpture modeled after God's own image and likeness. Yet the one who fits us together has a vision for us beyond our own understanding. Christ assembles us together, so we can delight in discovering the part we will each play in God's family.

It can be exciting, but also frustrating: not knowing who or what God is calling us to be. Some days we might feel more like spectators than active participants in what's going on at church; but whether we're aware of it or not, church just isn't the same when any single one of us is missing, and not for the reasons we might assume. Sure, God wants us to bring our gifts and our talents to help build up the kingdom of heaven. Yet we have at the center of our faith one rejected by the political powers and religious leaders of the time. So, we can offer to God in liturgy our weakness and our failings as much as our triumphs. Christ is the good shepherd who doesn't shy away from binding the wounds of his sheep or feeding them when they are hungry. Above all else, Christ lays his life down to protect his flock and to keep them together.

This Easter season, our parish welcomed five people to the sacraments of initiation. Each came with different backgrounds and experiences of doing church. As they went through the rites, each was amazed at how the sacraments really worked to fit them into the fold. One described it as a feeling of satisfaction, fullness, and completeness. It sounds like the way the first apostles explained to others how the power of the Spirit felt, like Peter did in today's first reading. We too can dare to imagine that God is working to fit us into the building up of the kingdom in ways we have yet to uncover. As we gather around the table for Eucharist, we can lay down our anxieties and fears at the shepherd's feet, eager that he will once again find a way to fit whatever we bring into God's family.


