2nd Sunday of Easter: Acts 2:42-47; Ps 118; 1 Peter 1:3-9; John 20:19-31

It sounds like the early disciples lived in an idyllic community where each was dedicated to promoting the common good. It's not so hard to believe that they shared their possessions and distributed them according to the needs of the community. What is difficult to wrap our heads around is that they shared their food and homes together "with glad and generous hearts." Weren't they afraid that they would run out of food if they kept giving it away? Surely there were some along the way who argued for caution and prudence in the face of what seemed like reckless abandon.

Maybe that's why some of the disciples had their doubts about the testimony of the others. If Jesus had indeed been raised from the dead, this news ought to change the entire order of everything. Before, people were born, they lived, and then they died. End of story. The only real question is how much living a person can squeeze in before the ride is over. A risen Jesus overturns that story and replaces it with a different one: one that says life lasts forever-life is abundant, eternal, and never-ending. Instead of trying to hoard up life, real joy comes from giving it away, as Jesus did. It would make sense that a community that lived according to this belief would share everything without a second thought of the cost.

However, it would only be a matter of time before doubt sets in. Would life really last forever? What if it could run out again? Best to lock the doors and keep out the people that scare us—the people that threaten to steal our life away. Seeing his friends act this way, Thomas doubted that they had really seen Jesus risen from the dead. If it had really been Jesus, Thomas expected the disciples would be out in the streets proclaiming this good news to the people without a care for their own lives. Instead, he found his friends holed up in a locked room, just as scared as before.

While the disciples were huddled together, something amazing happened. Jesus breaks into the locked room, stands among them, and gives them his peace. The peace Jesus gives is the tranquility of a new order that says their life will not run out. He sends them out to share the good news of this peace. The only way to do this is to live life as though it will never run out. Jesus' life never ran out, so he gave his all away; now we can too.
