Pope's Pastoral Works:

On Sunday, May 6, a collection for the Pope's Pastoral Works will be taken up during the offertory collection. A dedicated envelope is included in your offertory envelope box, or can be found at all church entrances. This collection provides an opportunity for Catholics to make a financial offering to assist the Holy Father. One-third of the funds collected is for what is traditionally known as Peter's Pence: donations used by the Pope for his charitable contributions for those most in need. Two-thirds of the collection is to support the Holy Father in administering the Holy See and serving the Universal Church (Canon 1271).

April 28/29, 2018: 5th Sunday of Easter

Fifth Sunday of Easter: Acts 9:26-31; Psalm 22; 1 John 3:18-24; John 15:1-8

Last month, Pope Francis issued an apostolic exhortation. This type of papal document is meant to inspire the faithful, not to lay out formal doctrine like an encyclical letter would. While using this format carries more weight than other forms of papal letters, Francis nonetheless writes with a bit of playful sassiness. The exhoratation, *Gaudate et Exsultate*, meaning "Rejoice and be glad," is about the call to holiness in today's world, and the Pope's writing style reflects his subject. Speaking to the effect of constant access to entertainment and distraction in our free time, he says, "This denatures our spiritual experience." As a young man, Pope Francis trained as a chemist, and it's delightful to see him use such vivid terms to describe a common experience. Later in the document, while describing the Christian commitment to show hospitality to all strangers, he writes, "This is not a notion invented by some pope, or a momentary fad." How amusing to hear the Roman Pontiff speak so unpretentiously. The document's breeziness belies the depth of reflection on display. There is much here worth meditating on and it applies very concretely to everyday life.

In the second chapter, Pope Francis mentions two ancient forms of false holiness that remain perennial traps among the faithful: the heresies of Gnosticism and Pelagianism. Gnosticism holds that salvation comes strictly through understanding complex beliefs, as though enlightening oneself with special knowledge is sufficient to attain holiness. Gnostics become closed off from the mystery of God—they are never surprised by grace, for they already have "an answer for every question." It confuses faith for certainty. "Someone who wants everything to be clear and sure presumes to control God's transcendence." God sustains us with grace, not with mere empty knowledge that puffs us up over others. Grace fills our lives so we overflow with mercy to one another. Some might seek to reduce the gospel "to a cold and harsh logic that seeks to dominate everything."

Where the gnostic attributes too much power to knowledge, the Pelagian looks to the human will as means of salvation. Instead of relying on God, the Pelagian looks to their own personal effort to bring them to holiness. "Once we believe that everything depends on human effort as channeled by ecclesial rules and structures, we unconsciously complicate the Gospel and become enslaved to a blueprint that leaves few openings for the workings of grace." This attitude blocks our growth, for it ignores the real limitations we face in our circumstances and overlooks areas where we need to ask God for the strength we need to live out lives of holiness. We are works in progress who are looking to bear fruit for the Kingdom of Heaven—it should not alarm us that it takes a lifetime to cultivate such a harvest. The good news in today's Gospel is that Christ the true vine indeed sustains us with grace, so we can show mercy to one another.
