



April 7/8, 2018: 2nd Sunday of Easter

Second Sunday of Easter: Acts 4:32-35; Psalm 118; 1 John 5:1-6; John 20:19-31

This week our kids, Callie and Nicholas, asked their mother about a scar on her leg. She fell off a bicycle when she was 8 and the mark is still there. Then they noticed the scar on my lip from a dog bite when I was 5. "Do scars last forever?" Nicholas asked. The scars last, as do the stories of how we get them. Our marks become part of who we are. They identify us. In the Gospel today, Thomas refuses to believe his friends' account of the Risen Lord. At least, he would not believe without first putting his finger in the nail marks and his hand in his side. The curious thing about this encounter was that Christ indulged Thomas' doubts—Christ invited Thomas to feel his wounds. Christ was risen, yet scarred. Christ did not hide his wounds, but shared them openly so that Thomas might come to believe, and through believing that he might have life in Christ.

In the Acts of the Apostles, those who believed were of one heart and one mind. Their belief brought them together to live a radically communal life, joyfully sharing what they had among each other so that no one was in need. It's a vision of church life that strikes us as quaint. Nowadays, the Church is an institution that bears many scars and wounds. When people think of church, they're more likely to call to mind scandals like residential schools and clergy abuse than they are to imagine the utopic scene from Acts 4. We might be tempted to hold the identity of the Church as a holy institution entirely free from sin, but this would ignore those people who have suffered trauma at the Church's hands. Church has been a community that has both hurt and healed.

It says in the Letter of John that Christ came not only with water, but with water and blood. The water is baptism, that moment of rebirth and initiation into the church. The blood is the Eucharist, the Holy Communion that binds us together and then pours us out into the world. Christ's wounds are a sign of his communion with us. Christ heals our wounds and shares our scars, so we can tell the stories of how we got them. Church is not a place to cover up our wounds and pretend to be put together and holy. It is a place to uncover the stories of how we were hurt and how we hope together to find healing.


