

August 12/13, 2017: 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: 1 Kings 19:9, 11-13; Psalm 85; Romans 9:1-5; Matthew 14:22-33

The prophet Elijah had a dramatic showdown with the priests of Baal. The Israelites were torn between following Baal or following the Lord. The prophets of Baal numbered four hundred and fifty; Elijah was the only prophet of the Lord left. He challenged his rivals to sacrifice a bull to their god, Baal, with the condition that Baal light the fire himself. So the priests cried to their god to come and light the wood under their offering. They thrashed and wailed around their altar—they even went so far as to slash at their arms with blades—all in a bid to invoke a divine flame from Baal. As they received no answer, Elijah jeered them and mocked Baal for being absent or asleep. Then, before the entire assembly of Israel, Elijah took his turn. He repaired the Lord's altar that had been thrown down, and then he asked the Lord to accept Elijah's offering. The fire of the Lord consumed the sacrifice and the people were convinced—they seized all the false prophets and not one escaped. The drought that had plaqued the land ended immediately.

God was faithful to Elijah: he triumphed against overwhelming odds and won the acclaim of the people. Yet, Elijah was still afraid of the ruler, Jezebel; she threatened to do to Elijah what he had done to his opponents. So he fled and sought refuge in a cave on mount Horeb. Up on that mountain, Elijah heard the Lord speak, not in raging wind, nor in forceful tremors, but in the still of silence. The voice of the Lord rang clear, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" Elijah had helped turn the people back to God, but he himself was still afraid. Despite having seen firsthand the power of the Lord to vanguish his opponents, Elijah was still scared. Why doubt now, after having won so handily?

In our own faith lives, we too have tried to play the prophet. When we have stood against overwhelming odds in support of unpopular views, when we avoid the path of least resistance to do what's right, we stand in the shoes of those before us who did the same. We have risked our reputations and worldly gains to speak the truth. Sometimes though, we're too afraid, too tired, or too slow to take a stand. We let a racist comment slip by without question because we doubt ourselves. We hesitate to help when confronted by the storms that devastate the weakest among us: poverty, addiction, and marginalization. Rather than risk sinking, sometimes we choose to stay in the boat. It's in those moments that the voice of the Lord echoes loudest, "What are you doing here?" Our place is not in the boat, it's out on the water in the thick of the wind and the rain. Christ catches us when we fall, so we can risk sinking when we confront the idols in our lives.




