

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time: Isaiah 22.15, 19-23; Romans 11.33-36; Matthew 16.13-20

Prayer is a more dangerous activity than we might think. Even a prayer as seemingly innocuous as the Lord's Prayer—which we just as often stumble through based on the rise and fall of the voices around us as we proclaim it with hearts on fire with faith—is replete with some scary things to say to God. For instance, we ask God to "Forgive us our trespasses as forgive those who trespass against us." How often have we read through these words without realizing that we're telling God to forgive our sins only to that same extent that we are willing to forgive others? Perhaps the scariest line is, "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." We might talk like God's in charge, but if we're honest about it, deep down we might hope that's not really true. So, while we might talk about God's will being done, chances are we're really banking on him not taking that too seriously.

Peter might have been going through something similar when he made his statement about Jesus; he probably didn't fully understand what he was agreeing with when he called Jesus the Messiah, the Son of the Living God. Sure, it sounded like the correct answer at first, but after Jesus explained to the disciples that he was to suffer and die, Peter certainly acted like a rock—Jesus called him a stumbling-block! Our own faith can be like this too. It's a double-edged sword that is sometimes the foundation on which we build our lives; other times we trip over what it really stands for. So the power that Jesus invests in Peter, to bind and loose on earth as it is in heaven, is really quite precarious. Anyone who's ever locked themselves out knows that having the keys doesn't guarantee using them wisely. What's to stop us from locking ourselves out of the Kingdom with our pravers, and not even realize it?

It might not be Peter's answer to Jesus that is so important then. He gets it wrong as much as he gets it right; much like we get our own faith at different times. The real good news of this Gospel might be in Jesus' answer to Peter. Just as Peter had a name for Jesus, Jesus had one for him too. Jesus claimed Peter as his very own personal rock, stumbling block and all, and so made a place for him. If there's room in God's Kingdom for Peter, a disciple and a blockhead, then there's room for us too. Jesus claims us as his own so we have a place in God's Kingdom. Even in our most boneheaded, backwards moments, there is a place for us here in God's church. So we can say the most startlingly prayers here, things we would never agree to without faith, because God claims us as his own despite ourselves.
