

August 5/6, 2017: Transfiguration of the Lord

The Transfiguration of the Lord: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14; Psalm 97; 2 Peter 1:16-19; Matthew 17:1-9

Faith doesn't sell very well these days. Our culture is deeply skeptical, aloof, and isolating. Consumerism has taught us to maximize our utility at every turn. So, how we spend Sunday morning is subject to a cost-benefit analysis. Church doesn't fare well against such a test for most. One lapsed Catholic comedian gave an honest assessment of himself why he stopped coming, "Part of it was I'm lazy... and the other part was I already heard all the stories... three or four times and the dude hasn't come back yet." More and more people are spiritual, but not religious—good people, to be sure, who are open-minded and kind, who reserve belief for things they can see. If we're honest with ourselves, we all feel that way sometimes. It's not that we haven't heard the Gospel—we know the stories—sometimes it's just hard to buy it.

While this feels like a new problem for the Church, it's been an issue from the beginning. To St. Paul's audience, the Gospel of a crucified Christ was a stumbling block and foolishness. From today's reading in the Second Letter of Peter, "For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty." It wasn't the cohesiveness of the narrative or the potential profit in running a church that won Peter over to Christ. It was the experience that transformed Peter from a fisherman to an apostle. He saw Christ on that mountaintop and heard the voice from heaven call Jesus "My beloved". He was there when Jesus was arrested, and he fled, scared that he might be next. The last we hear about Peter in Matthew's Gospel is him leaving and weeping bitterly at his own betrayal of his friend. The eleven disciples show up in the end, together on the same mountaintop as today's Transfiguration reading, but even then some among them doubted. So our doubts are nothing new.

The good news is that God lights the path from disbelief to faith, from death to life, so we find hope even in the bleakest of times. Peter did. Looking back on his experience, he came to see Christ as the Morningstar—the first light before the dawn rising in our hearts. Venus is the brightest light in the night sky, often appearing early in the morning before the sun, so it was named the Morningstar, a harbinger of the coming daylight during the darkest hours. The Morningstar reflected the light of sun yet to rise. The early Church saw in this a symbol for Christ, the firstborn of the new creation, blazing a path across the night sky, giving hope to all for the coming day. How many of us have faced a dark night in our own lives, when the path we're on has led us to a dark place? It is then that God gives us hope that the light is still there, ready to shine on us once again, even if we can't see it yet. We can trust the light of Christ to never burn out and to never lead us astray, even when we find ourselves adrift. So we set a course for ourselves, not by some arbitrary measure or by the latest fad; we travel a path that leads to an encounter with the risen Christ. It's a trip worth taking, even on lazy Sundays.




