### DECEMBER 18/19, 2010 FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

**Isaiah 7.10-14** Look, the virgin is with child. A King declines the invitation to place his trust in God. Even so, a prophet announces that God's plan of salvation will move forward.

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 24.1-2, 3-4ab, 5-6

R. May the Lord come in; he is king of glory.

**ROMANS 1.1-7** Jesus Christ, descended from David, was declared to be the Son of God. Paul introduces himself as the slave of Christ Jesus and explains what this means for his ministry.

**MATTHEW 1.18-24** Jesus was born of Mary, who was engaged to Joseph, son of David. Joseph learns in a dream that Mary has come to be with child through the power of the Holy Spirit.

### SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament of the anointing of the Sick is a celebration in which those who are seriously ill or infirm are surrounded and supported by other members of the community.



The Mass begins as usual. There is a welcome and then special prayers for those to be anointed. After the homily, there is a litany of prayers for those who will be anointed and for those who care for them. The sick then come to the altar. The priest lays his hands on the head of the person to be anointed, recalling Jesus' own usual manner of healing. The priest makes the Sign of the Cross with the blessed oil on the sick person's forehead, saying: "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." All respond: "Amen." Then the priest anoints the palms of the sick one's hands with the Sign of the Cross: " May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." All respond: "Amen." The Mass continues as usual.


