

December 12/13, 2015: Third Sunday of Advent

Third Sunday of Advent: 9 Zephaniah 3:14-18a; Philippians 4:4-7; Luke 3:10-18

W.H. Vanstone grew up during the Great Depression in a poor neighbourhood in the north of England. His father was the pastor of an Anglican parish which was the centre of social support for the community. However, by the time Vanstone become a parish priest himself during the 1950s, state-run social organizations met the material needs of his community, not the church. Nonetheless, the church persisted in a new role: to enrich and sustain the life of the community. For three generations, his parish had ran two schools, owned and maintained the district's sport fields, and had involved more people than any other local club or centre.

Then he was unexpectedly chosen to start a parish in a new community of corporate housing. There had been no church presence in this place before. He made over a dozen visits to the district before the church was built. Those he met were courteous to him, but without exception, all were indifferent to the new parish. The town's civic officials were satisfied with their planning and that were confident any unforeseen social problems could be addressed by their own organizations, effectively telling Vanstone that there was no need of a church. He faced the depressing realization that his new parish would be, at best, "a harmless hobby-an alternative to, and on par with, the activities of the Drama Society or the Scout Group." This was guite a contrast from his previous experiences of church and he fell into despair about his upcoming appointment.

Then one day, while touring the new district, he was suddenly filled with a deep and inexplicable sense of consolation. St. Paul knew that feeling too, what he calls "the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding." Vanstone describes the feeling he received as a pure gift from God—a revelation that the purpose of the church lies beyond working to redeem human suffering in times of struggle, just as it lies beyond celebrating moments of triumph in times of plenty. Freed from the constraints of his own notions of church, he set about an intense period of practical activity to set up his new parish, all the while trusting his newfound conviction that the church's success was no longer contingent on the results or circumstances of the community it engaged. The church was not just another club or group, but the actual offering made to God in response to the love that Christ has poured out for the world.

Like Vanstone, John the Baptist also faced dissatisfaction with his ministry. The people kept asking John what they should do. His answers were right and just: share with the needy, treat your neighbours fairly, and don't abuse your office or position. The people were impressed with John and wondered if he might be the one anointed by God to redeem them. John however, wanted more. It was not enough to inspire people to be meet the needs of others, not enough to lead them to celebrate their own goodness. John pointed to that something more. Christ is on his way, to make of his people a pure offering, a perfect sacrifice. The excess of the harvest will be trimmed away, the chaff thrown to the fire, but the wheat will be gathered up and carefully saved. Not a single grain will be lost, as God will spend everything to make sure that every last grain is gathered up. We can ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate rejoice in the one who spends it all to gather us together.
