# December 13/14, 2014: Third Sunday of Advent

Third Sunday of Advent: Isaiah 61:1-2; 10-11; Luke 1; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24; John 1:6-8, 19-28 We might ask ourselves the questions posed to John the Baptist in today's gospel. "Who are you?" I imagine this will be as hard to answer at fifty years old as it was to answer at fifteen. Where do you start? The baptismal rite says, "As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body..." These words are spoken as the celebrant traces an oily cross on the newly baptized. It's a simple act that makes one a Christian in the most literal sense: Christ means "anointed one" so, to become a Christian, one need be anointed too. Who are you? A Christian: a little anointed one.

"What do you say about yourself?" With the title of "Christian" comes some of the same responsibilities expected of God's priests, prophets and kings (or queens). We hear some of those responsibilities in today's first reading: bring good news to the oppressed, bind up the broken-hearted, proclaim liberty to captives and release to prisoners; basically to proclaim today as the year of the Lord's favour. So, how are you coming along in your royal priestly duties? If you're daunted by these responsibilities, you're in good company. Baptism is no radioactive spider bite—I have yet to see a newly baptized person develop the kind of superpowers we might think are needed to bring liberty to captives. I liberated a piece of cheesecake from its refrigerator prison last night, but I don't think that's what Isaiah had in mind.

"Why then are you baptizing?" What's the point of being anointed like Christ if we are not the Messiah, Elijah, or the prophet? John knew he wasn't playing with a full bag of marbles—he was baptizing only with water—but he kept at it anyways. John was open to a mysterious hope, "Among you stands one whom you do not know." John knew he wasn't the light, but he had faith that the light was there, somewhere. The priests sent to investigate John were frustrated with uncertainty, so they sought after definitive answers. John lived with the ambiguity because he trusted God to work in surprising ways. For us, being anointed with God's Spirit doesn't guarantee anything, but it does open up the possibility that, gathered around an altar with some bread and wine, we might witness a holy transformation in ourselves. We can dare to call ourselves anointed, not because we wield the Holy Spirit, but because we hope for God to pour out his Spirit into our hearts and change us into somebody more than we are: bread into body; wine into blood; and sinners into priests, prophets, and kings/queens.


