

The Archdiocesan Synod– Continuing our Walk Together

On the mild and sunny Saturday of December 2, 2017, delegates to the first Synod of the Winnipeg Archdiocese gathered once again at St. John XXIII Parish for our second general session. The gymnasium/ hall was very full, probably because rural delegates could drive safely this time: the first session's weather was stormy.

The delegates considered proposals from the four remaining Focus Commissions: Indigenous People, New Evangelization and Mission Outreach, Sacramental Preparation, Prayer and Devotional Life and Youth and Young Adults. Delegates had had plenty of opportunity to review and pray over the various Commissions' White Papers and proposals.

Parishioners who wish to read the White Papers and the proposals are invited to view these on the archdiocese's website: <u>http://www.archwinnipeg.ca/synod.php</u> But, to give you a sense of what the Synod doing at this point, we will offer you some commentary on the proposals concerning New Evangelization and Missionary Outreach.

"Evangelization" is the spreading of the Good News of Jesus Christ. For centuries, doing this meant sending missionaries to non-Christian communities. However, more recently, the Church has come to recognize that evangelization is an on-going process for the baptized, too. These particular proposals are nothing new to our Catholic community; rather, they encourage us to strive even more faithfully in areas which today require a particular attention. This realization is reflected in the four proposals coming from the Focus Commission. Proposal #1 is "We create fully welcoming parish communities." This is a reminder that parish life is not about "people just like us" but in fact is enhanced by our recognizing Our Lord's injunction in Matthew 25: "When I was a stranger, you took me in."

The second proposal reads, "We become a Church in continuous formation." We must work against the human tendency to sit in "a comfortable pew." We must be open to (indeed we must actively seek) the movement of the Holy Spirit as the Spirit moves in our times. Moreover, we must respond "Yes" to this Spirit even if the response might make us uncomfortable.

The third reads, "We seek to provide space to listen to and understand the life stories of the people of the Archdiocese." Every person has a unique history which colours his/her response to the Gospel. We are not a "cookie cutter" church.

The fourth reads, "We be fully a Church that goes forth in mercy." There is a woeful tendency today to pass judgment on those whose views and whose life choices are not identical to our own. We must be attentive that since "we all do pray for mercy; that same prayer doth teach us to render the deeds of mercy." (*Merchant of Venice*)

The Synod has now approved in principle all the proposals submitted by the various Commissions. However, many delegates have proposed amendments to clarify and elucidate the proposals. In our next few general sessions, delegates will consider these amendments.

It must be stressed that this process is not about voting on what each of us thinks. Rather, delegates are bound to reflect on and pray over proposals, asking the Holy Spirit to enlighten us. The support of your prayers is fundamental to this process. Thank you.
