

First Sunday of Advent Year B: Isaiah 63:16-16; 64:1,3-8; Psalm 80: 1 Cor 1:3-9; Mark 13:33-37

Advent couldn't be over fast enough when we were kids. The gradual lighting of the wreath was a torturous reminder of the seemingly interminable wait for the sheer bliss of Christmas. We measured the days by calendar chocolates and how-many-sleeps-left. We knew exactly how far Dec. 25 was from today. Given the means, we would have gladly jumped ahead, skipping over the month like it was daylight savings. All that potential energy smouldered away as slowly as the candles firmly affixed in their motionless wheel of a wreath.

How different is the waiting now, where the days seem to pile onto one another, faster and faster down the assembly line, whether we're ready to contend with each one or not. The once-steady advent wreath seems to have been swapped for a spinning top—a trade that slipped by us unnoticed even as we live out its effects every day. "Time passes like water through a sieve." We might wish for a jar instead, to bottle up the moments so they could be labeled and sealed with a lid. Time is a hungry beast that eats its children, each moment consumes the one before it, even as it chases after the next. Dare we expect to find God in this mess?

Jesus indicates that there is a season, a decisive time set aside, which we must catch. His command is to watch, to stay awake. Oh, but the time passes so slowly then when we watch. Better to stay busy; better to work away the days and sleep away the nights. God doesn't keep banker's hours; the master could show up later, at midnight, or sooner, at daybreak. So, do we add Jesus' warning to the Christmas list? Do the shopping, trim the tree, polish the silver, watch out for God... something seems off about this.

God carves out a time for us to pour his spirit into our hearts. "We are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand." God fashions us into containers for his Spirit to once again be born into the world—a busy place with too many distractions and too little time. We long for God to act in a way that would make the mountains tremble, that would slow down the relentless march of time. Into this oppressive stream of passing moments, a fragile vessel becomes our hope. Amid the flooding waters we cling to the cross, "that paltry piece of wood" like it were Noah's ark itself, and God once more makes a dwelling place on earth.

Holy Family: Gen 15:1-6, 17:3-5, 15-16, 21:1-7; Heb 11:8, 11-12, 17-19; Luke 2:22-40

In the midst of the high season of time spent together with family, the Church sees fit to celebrate that families are indeed holy. Perhaps this is easier to believe when we have spent time apart from them than when they are still there sleeping on the fold out in the living room. While Holy Family brings to mind the nuclear family of Mary, Joseph, and little baby Jesus, it is important to celebrate the many forms that family takes. After all, Jesus was essentially adopted by Joseph. There is nothing traditional about the families we meet in today's readings.

God chose a retired couple, beyond their child bearing years, to be the progenitors of his covenant. In the twilight of their lives, as Abram and Sarai were winding things down, God suddenly shows up and announces a new direction for them. God renames them to fit their new identities in his covenant and promises them descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky. One moment their writing their wills, getting ready to name their servant as heir; the next they find themselves setting up a crib and picking out paint for a nursery. The whole situation was so fantastical, Sarah couldn't contain her laughter. You thought your family was weird: try crazy aunt Sarah and uncle Abe having a baby at a hundred years old!

Mary and Joseph don't drive straight home to Nazareth after giving birth at Bethlehem Memorial; they take Jesus to Jerusalem to perform the ritual prescribed for a first -born. There they share their joy with a devout local, Simeon, who speaks a word of blessing and praise. For all the excitement around Jesus' birth, you'd think that Mary and Joseph would have expected something special at the temple, but even this simple prayer of Simeon's astonishes them as much as the angels and shepherds in the manger. The joy and mystery of being a parent is amplified when it is shared. When our ministers of communion bless our parish's children, we are channeling something of that visit with Simeon, proclaiming the goodness of God's gift of life to this church.

The prophet Anna lived only seven of her eight-four years with her husband. She spent many more years at the temple, dedicating herself to prayer. She saw something that day of Jesus' visit, a fulfillment of God's promise that moved her to preach a word of good news to those at the temple. Our own families are guided and shaped by the wisdom passed on to us from our elders. Children grow up with many grandparents beyond their own flesh and blood—they don't distinguish love by relation. Our families, in all their forms, are indeed holy, because God has chosen to bring us together as family. Unlike our friends, who we choose, God gives us our family. We can receive this gift with joy knowing it was picked out for us with great care, even if they're not who we would have picked ourselves!


