Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14; Psalm 128; Colossians 3:12-21; Luke 2:22-40


Paul's letter to the Colossians outlines some necessary skills to living a harmonious family life. Although straightforward, these skills are often difficult to put into practice. For instance, forgiveness doesn't just happen automatically—it is enacted and brought to life, carefully and consciously. When we practice forgiveness in our homes, we open ourselves to a hopeful future that is not ruled by past disappointments. Forgiveness liberates us to be the kinds of neighbours, friends, parents, and children, God calls us to be. God builds up our families with the gift of forgiveness, so we experience God's grace in our homes.

God taught Jesus about forgiveness through his own family and their traditions. In Luke's Gospel, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to dedicate their firstborn to the Lord. Their Jewish faith prescribed this ritual to them and they followed it diligently. As they approached the temple to make their offering, a pair of prophets, Simeon and Anna, encountered the family, blessed them and left them with a word of God's goodness through this child. This scene reminds us that Jesus was brought up in a faith-filled environment, one rich with tradition. The people in Jesus' community were deeply embedded in the stories of their faith, so they lived in expectation that the Lord would continue to work in their lives in mysterious and astonishing ways. The radical message of God's endless mercy that Jesus would testify to as an adult took root in him as a child. He grew up steeped in the stories of how God acted in the world to show mercy to those most in need, and how God's justice brought down the powerful and the proud.

Like Jesus, we too have access to stories and traditions—passed on to us from our families—that build up our sense of wonder and delight in God's forgiveness. We get to live out the stories ourselves, and bear witness to the next generation how God shows up in our lives too. God shows up for us those times when we are strangers in a new place and we are welcomed; when we feel guilty beyond measure and receive forgiveness instead of condemnation; when we find joy again after the loss of a loved one. God's grace abounds in our lives, so we can sing God's praises to others and show them a love that exceeds our own capacities. St. Paul includes singing as a practice that builds up families. Jesus drew on the psalms he would have heard as a faithful Jew to articulate the good news of God's mercy to those who needed to hear it. We bring our kids to church and sing to them songs about a love that never ends, about a life that extends past death, and about a bond of friendship that never breaks, so they too can look for those moments of grace in their lives and so they can be agents of God's kingdom to those most in need of a word of good news. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson
