## Second Sunday of Advent Year A: Isaiah 11:1-10; Psalm 72; Romans 15:4-9; Matthew 3:1-12

Our 4-month-old daughter has begun picking up and biting things—well, gumming them. She gets upset when she tries to put something in her mouth when her soother is already in there. She'll bring up her teething ring for a bite, only find that there's no room for it. Her frustration builds as she repeats this over and over again. I could stand by and watch the comedy unfold, but I know this is going to end only when she starts crying. So I intervene and pluck the soother out for her, freeing her to chomp greedily on the rubber ring. Sometimes we need help letting go of the things in our lives that keep us from being truly fulfilled.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist imagines Christ as a thresher—one who separates the grain kernels from the straw. Jesus gathers the seeds in his barn and pitchforks the husks into an "unquenchable fire." The image is a stark one, scary even, if we consider ourselves to be either seeds or straw. We hope we're the grain that gets saved, but we're not always sure. Sometimes we feel more like the hollow shells that get crushed under foot and swept aside. Why would God want to save people who hold grudges for years; people who say one thing, then do another; people who insist on their own way; people who are too scared to reach out and help their neighbours? Maybe we feel the opposite: we encounter other people like this and wish that they would be cut down at the root and tossed away.

In reality, we all have parts of ourselves that aren't bearing good fruit. We're all part straw and part grain. Like the thresher, Jesus comes into each of our lives to clear out the straw—the stuff that gets in the way. God clears away the unnecessary things that keep us from bearing good fruit. The Pharisees and Sadducees presumed they were entitled to baptism because of their identity. In the heavenly kingdom however, the only status that matters is being a child of God. This is conferred through God's grace, not by one's family of origin or profession. All other parts of our identity get cleared away. Maybe this won't be so scary after all, but more like a parent helping their child set aside what's in the way so she can sink her teeth into what really matters.
