Third Sunday of Advent Year A: Isaiah 35:1-6a, 10; Ps 146; James 5:7-10; Matt 11:2-11

This season can be as much a source of stress and loneliness than of peace and joy. The "holiday spirit" can feel less like a promise from God and more like a command from an oppressive regime. So it's fitting that we run into desert imagery in today's first reading. The dry cracked earth waits patiently for the flash of rain that rouses the dormant greenery to life. Likewise, we too wait thirstily for God to revive our spirits during the darkest, coldest months. The temptation while we wait for God in the desert is to force his arrival. We sometimes short-circuit the waiting by settling for false gods: consumption masked as generosity; ostentation disguised as hospitality; "holiday magic" passing as holy sacrament. We can be patient though, because God works constantly in our lives to bring life and hope, even when it seems like the seeds to that life are trapped under the parched sands of despair. Pope Francis' first encyclical letter talks about faith and this kind of waiting on God:

"The history of Israel also shows us the temptation of unbelief to which the people yielded more than once. Here the opposite of faith is shown to be idolatry. While Moses is speaking to God on Sinai, the people cannot bear the mystery of God's hiddenness, they cannot endure the time of waiting to see his face. Faith by its very nature demands renouncing the immediate possession which sight would appear to offer; it is an invitation to turn to the source of the light, while respecting the mystery of a countenance which will unveil itself personally in its own good time." (Lumen Fidei. 13)

John the Baptist was going through something of his own spiritual drought. King Herod arrested John for publicly decrying his relationship with his brother's wife. So when reports about Jesus reached John, his imprisonment spoiled the good news for him. His anxiety got the better of him, and he displayed a moment of uncertainty uncharacteristic of a prophet. After all, the Messiah was expected to bring liberty to captives, and here John was stuck in jail. Yet Jesus praises John. His uncertainty is not a weakness; it is the opposite of idolatry. The Baptist's question is our own as we await God to show up in our lives, "Are you the one?" When our own spiritual drought gives way to a blossoming oasiswhen the soil we thought was lifeless will teem with new life-we can give thanks to the one who planted the seeds without us even realizing they were there all along. ~Tom Bailev Robertson.
