

# 6th Sunday of Ordinary Time: Lev 13:1-2, 45-46; 1 Cor 10:31-11:1; Mark 1:40-45

At first glance, the man in rags approaching Jesus could have easily been mistaken for a beggar. As he drew closer, small details raised suspicions that he might have leprosy: the wild hair shooting out from holes in his hood, the white spot on his hand that clutched at his cover. Usually a leper would cry out "unclean" if passing through a crowd, but this man did not. He made his way purposefully towards Jesus, although he kept his distance from others. Even as he began to speak to Jesus, the man stayed so far withdrawn that conversation required speaking in a loud, awkward tone. Jesus stopped in his tracks and looked at the kneeling man, his head bowed dejectedly. Jesus' guts jumped at the sight of him. The man looked up to find Jesus standing over him, his hand reaching down to him. The touch of another's fingers on the man's skin was deeply satisfying, like sleeping in your own bed after being away from home for a long time. Jesus stretched out to cross the distance between him and the sick man to restore him to health.

Jesus told the now-healthy man to go quietly, but the man couldn't go back to being alone. He took every opportunity to throw his arm around a neighbour and tell his amazing story. Where he had once been confined to the outskirts of town, now he bounded up and down the middle of the streets, relishing in the astonished faces that had replaced the looks of disdain. Not only had Jesus restored his health, he was now fully alive for the first time in a long time. Now he worked as hard to share his life as he had previously tried to contain his leprosy.

This story of healing a man's leprosy calls to mind the Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation I where it says, "Indeed, though we once were lost and could not approach you, you loved us with the greatest love: for your Son... did not disdain to be nailed for our sake to the wood of the Cross. But before his arms were outstretched between heaven and earth, to become the lasting sign of your covenant, he desired to celebrate the Passover with his disciples." Just as Jesus stretched out his hand to heal the man with leprosy, so too did he stretch out his hands on the cross to heal the world. God established a new covenant relationship with us all-one where Christ's outstretched arms on the cross bridge the distance between heaven and earth. His outstretched arms also bring in close those whom we would sometimes prefer to keep on the margins and at a distance. We all stand face-to-face, reconciled, by the terms of this relationship. No one falls outside of God's reach.
