February 20/21, 2016: 2nd Sunday of Lent

2nd Sunday of Lent: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18; Philippians 3:17-4:1; Luke 9:28-36

It's hard to know what to say when we try to comfort people going through difficult times. Sometimes we turn to a cliché that would be better left unsaid. Chief among such offenders is that tired aphorism, "everything happens for a reason." While it is acceptable for a sufferer to speak these words—they can express a sense of faithfulness amidst anguish—it is intolerable when a comforter utters them. It effectively shuts down any sharing of pain by short-circuiting the discussion; instead of listening, these words narrowly reframe the conversation away from hurt. Someone who refuses to allow a sufferer to share their pain is no comfort.

Even as Abram believed in the great plan God unfolded before him, he nevertheless felt overwhelmed—a "deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him." God had made sweeping promises to him. Though Abram was childless, God promised him descendants more numerous than the stars; though he wandered about homeless, God promised him land to settle on and make a great nation. It all seemed too good to be true, so Abram cried out, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" God responded with a covenant ritual: the two parties entering into a covenant pass together between the split corpses of animals, agreeing that they would rather suffer the same fate as these animals than break their relationship. In Abrams' time of distress, God assured him with a sign of mercy so he could trust God's plan for him.

God revealed to Jesus what lay ahead for him in Jerusalem. Moses and Elijah appeared and spoke with Jesus about his exodus—a journey that would take him through the abyss to break the bondage of death and lead the way to eternal life. This was the long-awaited restoration of humankind to perfect relationship with God, something that was foretold from the beginning of creation. This plan was incomprehensible to Peter, and he speaks out of turn; while Jesus is looking ahead to Jerusalem, Peter would rather set up camp and stay on the mountain. An overshadowing cloud of God's presence interrupted and saved poor Peter from further ruining the moment. It was a merciful, albeit forceful, sign from God to stop talking and start listening.

Listening is an act of compassion—it requires vulnerability to allow pain to be shared without rushing to explain it away. Sometimes out of insecurity we would rather hide others' pain with mild sentiments. God, however, uses powerful signs to assure us, so we can be strong enough to stay silent and listen to the hurt that others face.


