7th Sunday Ordinary Time: Lev 19:1-2, 17-18; Ps 103; 1 Cor 3:16-23; Matt 5:38-48

Pain is like energy; it can't be destroyed, but it can be transferred. Perhaps this is why it is so difficult to be around people who are suffering. Like golfing in a thunderstorm, being around other peoples' pain is just asking to be struck by a bolt of latent hurt looking for an outlet. This person could be a lonely friend who's no longer fun to be with. They could be an aging parent, once the reliable cornerstone of a family, who is now resentful of depending on the care of others. This person could be a spouse harbouring guilt over an embarrassing addiction. They are the people who mourn, who are hungry, or who are sick. They don't always deal with what pains them with the serene grace and patience we imagine we might have if we were in their shoes. Negative feelings like fear, shame, loss, and self-loathing are all too often at the core of hurtful behaviours. So it can be easier to avoid hurting people. If we can't ignore them, we might find ourselves hurting other people back for the abuse we've endured ourselves from hurting people. A basic flight or fight response to trauma is the most ordinary thing in the world. We avoid the pain or pass it on.

Pain asserts itself so strongly in our lives and demands our respect; it is a twisted entity that craves more than just attention—it wants our worship. Pain points to death. It threatens us with non-existence. "Look what I can do to you," it says, "I can strip away all that you have and hold dear." Standing before this threat, we can run or we can give in and become agents of this force. Either way, it feels like the hurt wins.

Jesus imagines a third way to cope with pain and trauma beyond evasion or retaliation: transformation. Rather than bow to altar of death, Jesus mocks pain for craving our worship. To offer the other cheek to an oppressor, to give up your underwear to the one who would sue you for your shirt, and to keep marching when the drill sergeant is tired—these are all acts of creative resistance. The forces of pain expect our total submission, but Jesus refuses to cooperate with them. Death has no power over him because he belongs to the Kingdom of God. He won't back away, nor will he play by death's violent rules. Jesus announces that God reigns, not death. We too can put our faith in God. Like Jesus, we can stand up to the hurts in our lives and proclaim that they hold no claim on us, for we are God's children—we belong to the Lord of life. We need not run away from suffering, nor serve it, but stand before it and refuse its demands. We can strip away the power of pain, overcome our initial flight or fight response and reach out to those who suffer, because we belong to God. It's not an easy thing to do. Disciples enter the Kingdom of God naked, with worn feet and bruised cheeks, but free from the powers of this world that demand we relinquish our humanity.

From Father Mark:

I was reading one of the Catholic news feeds this week and I saw the announcement of the death of Boston Jesuit Father Daniel Harrington, SJ. I had never met Father Harrington, but he has had a significant influence on my understanding of scripture; he taught me how to use scripture as the basis of my preaching, years after my ordination. Father Harrington was a scriptural scholar who throughout his ministry helped to bring scripture to the heart of many people. Harrington was a scholar, author and professor of sacred Scripture at Boston College and at the Weston Jesuit School of Theology. He wrote more than 60 books on Scripture and the life and times of Jesus, illustrating his dedication to biblical scholarship. I am personally sad hearing of his death, but immensely grateful that his pastoral writing, his love of the priesthood and the love of Jesus Christ came through in how he taught scripture. He joins saints like Jerome and the gospel writers Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, and even Paul celebrating with their God the banquet prepared for them, and us. Rest in Peace +Father Harrington.


