



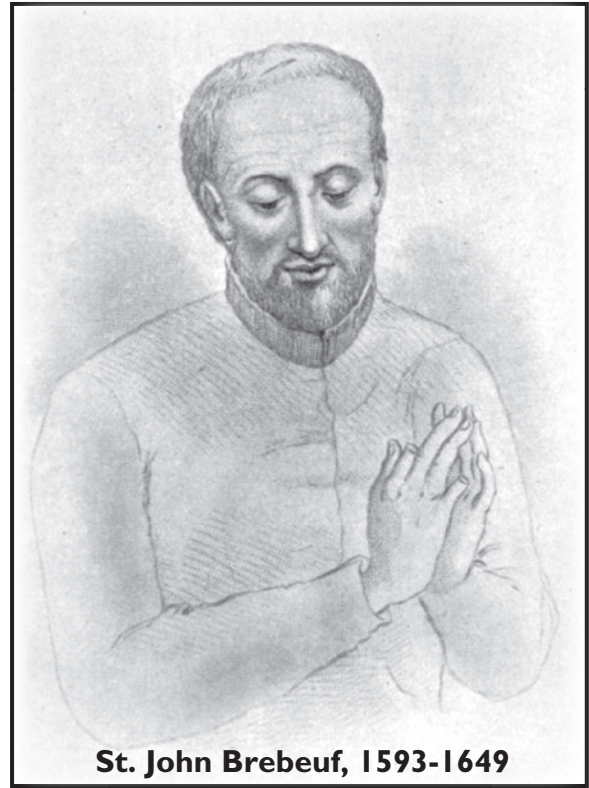

Attending In-Person Masses at St. John Brebeuf:

Our currently allowable capacity is 120 parishioners. Reservations are no longer required to attend Masses.

While in the church, Physical Distancing and the Use of Masks Is Required.

Please note that restrictions are subject to change and all updates will be posted at www.sjbcommunity.ca

A Reminder that all protocols are still in place!

Do not come to Mass if you are feeling ill, particularly if you are experiencing a cough, fever or respiratory symptoms.

Please **sanitize your hands** as you enter for Mass.

Please maintain **physical distancing of six feet** (2 meters) between people while in the building. **The Use of Masks is required in the church.**

Please **leave your offering in the designated basket** at the main church aisle when you enter the worship space.

Please limit seating to designated 'angel' pews. Unless you have come as a family unit, individual distancing of six feet (2 meters) within pews is required.

Once you have selected seating, please remain in your seat, except for the receipt of Communion. Parents, please keep your children with you.

Please **exit as soon as Mass ends** without pausing inside to chat.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding as we navigate the changing rules and regulations in place for the safety and well-being of all.

Pope Francis has announced the 'Synod on Synodality'. It's an opportunity for Catholic people to express their needs and experiences of the Church at the local and even international levels. How do we feel and think about what's happening around us? Your thoughts and opinions will be expressed and collected through a 'listening process'. These listening sessions are a critical part of the synodality journey. With the pandemic lingering on, our listening sessions here at St. John Brebeuf will take place mainly through the 'on-line' survey option prepared by our Archdiocese (with another option prepared for those who are less technological). Please do the survey when it is presented in the very near future. Take the time to think and pray about what you feel you should say. Everything you say is confidential in the sense that comments will not be linked to peoples' names. Comments will be collated and presented to the Archdiocesan synod office and from there will go on to the national and universal levels of the Catholic Church. Personally, I'm excited about this opportunity for us to have our say. It will be a blessing for us in our faith community.

Lent 2022:

Lent has a penitential character. During Lent, penance is an important requirement of Christian life. Fulfillment of this duty involves prayer, works of piety and charity, and self-denial by fulfilling one's obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the prescribed fast and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday in the Roman Rite, including Canada, are days of fasting* and of abstinence from meat.**

*Christian fasting obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open to prayer, to share more in the suffering of those who are starving and to save money to give to the poor. Fasting is a penitential discipline intended to open our hearts to God and others, a means of purification and spiritual liberation, a witness of the depth of our faith.

**The law of "abstinence from meat" binds those who are 14 and older; the law of "fasting" binds those from 18 to 59 years of age. Parents and educators are reminded of their duty to introduce children gradually to the understanding and practice of penance. The actions modeled by adults will be the greatest influence in this matter.
