Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The call of Jeremiah, prophet of the late seventh and early sixth centuries B.C., is featured in today's first reading. Jeremiah had a special relationship with God ("Before you were born I consecrated you"). His mission was enormously challenging ("stand up and tell them everything that I command you") and the Lord would protect him ("for I am with you...to deliver you"). Jeremiah is a courageous spokesperson!



Luke presents Jesus today as a prophet heralding the dawning of a new age. The people's reaction is disconcerting. First there is amazement, how could this local citizen claim such power? Then there is indignation -- a plot to slay the prophet by hurling him over the edge of the hill! Obviously, pain and hostility must be endured before Jesus' new age comes to glory.

We, too, by our common baptism and unique calling, are prophets for the kingdom. We will encounter many reactions, not all of them positive. Abstinence from Meat: Those who are 14 years or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fridays during Lent (starting Feb. 15):

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, 10am to Noon, followed by **Benediction**.
