

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Job 7:1-4, 6-7; Psalm 147; 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23; Mark 1:29-39

The book of Job syncs up nicely with the darkness of winter. "I am allotted months of emptiness, and nights of misery are apportioned to me." In the midst of his suffering, Job reflected on the futility of life: long days of hard labour and endless nights of fitful tossing and turning. Despite the days feeling long, the affair of life as a whole seemed to pass all too fast and end abruptly without meaning or hope. Job knew the pain of toiling away with great care, only to see the fruits of his endeavours and the blessings of his family swallowed up by the void as though they had never existed in the first place.

We need not have suffered as deeply as Job to know that feeling of hollowness in our own lives. When things don't turn out our way, even little daily obstacles can add up in our minds. It's only natural to focus on the negatives and miss the positives. We miss the light and the warmth of the sun during the darkest months, but after the first days of summer, we soon take the heat for granted. We all too easily fall into resentment; its long shadow can block out even the brightest moments and cause us to question, "What's the point?"

When Christ started proclaiming the Gospel, his words lifted people up from the emptiness of their labours and into the brilliance of God's Kingdom. The people caught a glimpse of a joyful existence in God's presence, where the broken-hearted are healed and the miserable demons are powerless to speak. Everybody, the whole town, came to see Jesus. They came searching for hope and for healing. Christ did not disappoint them. Christ entered their emptiness so they could see the fullness of God's presence even while they waited to find hope.

In the early hours of the morning, Christ withdrew to a secluded place to be alone. His solitude was the opposite of Job's restless, weary nights. He brought the people's loneliness and emptiness into God's presence through prayer. He offered God their frustration, their misery, and their suffering. Lofty achievements and proud accomplishments were not on the agenda, but broken hearts and hopeless spirits were. Today Christ gathers us together in prayer, not to pat one another on the back in celebration of our goodness, but to enter our emptiness. We can dare to sing praises to the Lord, even while we wait for our hope to come, because God is still the Lord of our lives even when we feel despair. Christ lifts us up in prayer.
